Worker's compensation; injury due to intoxication or drugs							

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

AB-499 provides for the denial of eligibility for all worker's compensation benefits to employees who are injured on the job due to intoxication by alcohol or controlled substances. Under current law, worker's compensation benefits are reduced by 15 percent to a maximum of \$15,000 in cases where injuries resulted from intoxication. AB-499 will require the denial of all benefits (compensation and medical expense) rather than a reduction of compensation by 15 percent.

It is unknown how many worker's compensation claims may be determined "not payable" under the provisions in AB-499, however the number is estimated to be very few. Therefore it is not anticipated to appreciably increase the workload of the Worker's Compensation Division (20.445(1)(ha) although the department may experience a few additional requests for hearings. This bill will result in a small decrease in the amount of expenditures that insurance companies and self-insured employers previously were liable for. The bill will not increase any appropriations.
