### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill creates various prohibitions, restrictions, and requirements, and makes changes in existing laws with respect to protection of personal privacy and security of personal information. It also changes the place of trial for certain existing crimes. The element of this bill that would affect the Department of Commerce is the requirement that individuals who are the subjects of public records relating to certain personnel matters must be notified prior to providing access to public records, and that the subjects may seek a court order preventing access to public records.

Current Department policy, predicated on s. 19.31, Stats., through s. 19.39, Stats., is that a requester has the right to inspect or copy any public record, unless otherwise prohibited by statute or as the result of a determination made by the agency's designated legal custodian that the public interest in withholding access to the record outweighs the public interest in providing access. There is currently no provision for notifying the subject of the records to which access has been requested.

Modifying the Department's procedure to include notification of the subject of the records to which access has been requested, and which fall under the criteria indicated in the bill, would result in a negligible impact on the Department's resources and would, therefore, have no fiscal impact. The Department also estimates that there would be no fiscal impact on local units of government in conforming to the notification requirements indicated in the bill.
