Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

AB621 relates to disclosure of records and information, in most cases limiting access to information which may impact personal privacy. It also requires state agencies to provide privacy impact statements on proposed legislation, when requested.

DMV records are subject to federal privacy guidelines under the Driver Privacy Protection Act (DPPA). In general, the DPPA guidelines and existing statutes related to DMV records are at least as stringent as these proposed requirements.

DMV includes privacy impact information and analyses in the fiscal estimate process. Therefore the Privacy Impact Statement requirement in this proposal would have no additional workload impact.

The Division of State Patrol would not be impacted by the provisions of this bill related to juvenile offenders and juvenile criminal investigations because of its limited interaction and investigative authority relating to juveniles.
