This bill eliminates the requirement in current law that applicants for hunting or fishing licenses under Chapter 29 of the statutes must provide their social security number and repeals the requirement that DNR must deny or suspend an application or revoke or suspend an approval if a person fails to provide the number. This provision, if enacted, would put DWD out of compliance with the requirement of the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1990 (P.L. 104-93) and the Balanced Budget Act of 1997 (P.L. 105-33) which require states to have procedures for the collection of social security numbers on applications for recreational licenses. This, in turn, would subject the state of Wisconsin to a potential loss of federal funding the state receives for W-2 and the child support program. Wisconsin currently receives over \$60 million annually in child support funding and \$317 million annually in federal TANF funding, all of which would be at risk. Additionally, the state's ability to enforce child support orders through the use of recreational license suspension would be prohibited, thereby potentially reducing child support collections.
