Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

While there is no state fiscal effect for the WTCS Board, individual districts may lose an indeterminate amount of revenue from parking fines that would no longer be levied. In many cases, however, enforcement of parking violations on technical college district property are the responsibility of a local municipality, not the district. It should be noted, however, that as districts have tried to make their educational offerings more flexible, the notion of a final examination period at the end of a semester is less relevant in the WTCS context. With open-entry, open-exit courses, final examinations may be offered at any time during the semester.
