## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

LRB 01-4966/1 would prohibit the County Board of Supervisors of Milwaukee County from increasing the salaries of County Board Supervisors or of the County Executive during their terms of office.

The Board would be able to increase the salaries of Supervisors and the County Executive for new terms of office but not during any term. Interim increases would be prohibited.

Salaries in effect for the Supervisors and the County Executive on the effective date of the bill would remain in effect for the terms of office that began immediately prior to the effective date of the bill.

The current annual salary for the Executive of Milwaukee County is \$128,820.

The current annual salary for each of the 25 Supervisors of the County Board of Supervisors is \$52,227.

On February 21, 2002, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors passed a resolution on the floor freezing their salaries and that of the County Executive through the next general election in spring of 2004.

This bill, therefore, has no fiscal effect on Milwaukce County through the next general election.
