<b>Subject</b> Individual's ownership of personal identifiers		

### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, a person is guilty of a Class D felony if the person intentionally uses or attempts to use the personal identification information of an individual, without the individual's consent, to obtain credit, money, goods, or anything else of value. In current law, personal identification information includes the individual's name, address, telephone number, or social security number.

This bill expands the list of personal identification information listed in current law to include the individual's post-office box number, nine-digit extended zip code, and electronic mail address. The bill also prohibits a person from selling, renting, or trading a personal identifier of an individual if:

(1) The person who sells, rents, or trades the personal identifier knows that the recipient of the sale, rental or trade intends to use the personal identifier for marketing purposes; and (2) the individual whom the personal identifier identifies has not given written permission for the sale, rental, or trade.

This bill has no fiscal effect on the Department of Public Instruction.

The bill likewise has no fiscal effect on local school districts. The exchange of pupil information is prohibited under the pupil record law, and teacher information is subject to open records law and the limitations contained therein.
