**Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

SB 184 would permit certain individuals to make written requests for medication for the purpose of ending their lives and providing penalties. This bill would have little or no fiscal impact on DOJ. DOJ is given no additional duties but may be required to represent the state on any legal action defending the law if it were to be enacted. If a challenge was made, DOJ would be required to defend the state and that is certain to have a fiscal effect.
