Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill provides that health care workers employed by health care facilities operated by the State of Wisconsin could file complaints of mandatory overtime retaliation with the Personnel Commission.

The Personnel Commission currently receives approximately 210 complaints of discrimination/retaliation annually. The Commission anticipates it will receive 20 complaints per year under the provisions of the bill.

The Commission's investigators cannot assume additional caseload without substantially increasing the existing investigative backlog (approximately 205 cases) and the average time necessary to complete the investigative process. Therefore, the Commission assumes a half-time Equal Rights Officer-Senior position will be required in order for the Commission to fulfill its investigative responsibilities under the bill. A half-time Equal Rights Officer-Senior position represents an annualized cost to the Commission of \$22,500 in salary and fringe benefits. A half-time position would also require approximately \$3,000 per year for supplies and services.

Some additional cases will also reach the administrative hearing stage. The Commission assumes that no additional staff positions will be required to perform the hearing function. The Commission also assumes that existing staff would prepare any appropriate changes to the Commission's administrative rules.

Any forfeiture paid by a state agency to the state under proposed sub. 146.999(5) of the bill would be offsetting.

This fiscal estimate does not reflect any costs to a state agency associated with remedies the Commission might impose under proposed par. 146.999(4)(b), if the agency was found to have violated the bill's prohibition.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The Commission expects that the level of complaints generated by the bill would continue indefinitely.
