#### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires law enforcement agencies to collect information concerning motor vehicle contacts made on or after January 1, 2002. There are at least 9 categories of information that a law enforcement officer must collect and forward to the Department of Justice. The department is then required to assemble all of this data, analyze it, and report the conclusions onto the Department of Transportation. Additionally, the department must issue an annual report.

The fiscal ramifications of the bill are two-fold; costs to local law enforcement and costs to the state.

Local Law Enforcement: Under the bill, the Department of Justice is responsible for the development of administrative rules and forms to implement the reporting system. Other states who have implemented such reporting requirements have estimated that this may increase the motor vehicle stop by 30 seconds to one minute. This may increase the costs to local governments but that is difficult for the state to estimate because the staffing decisions are made by local law enforcement and are dependent on their staffing decisions.

Despite the complexity of the information required to be collected under SB 354, it is the Department's intent to develop a check-off styled form that will allow officers to collect the information required very quickly and easily. This may mitigate any local governmental costs.

#### State Costs:

The development of the form, management of the reporting system and production of the required reports is estimated to require 1 FTE Program and Planning Analyst 5 (permanent), 1 FTE Program Planning Analyst 3 (project status for 2 years) and 1500 hours of consultant programming development costs.
