Increasing revenue limits for costs of teaching use of digital technology				

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill increases a school district's revenue limit by an amount equal to the costs of teaching school professional staff how to use digital technology and distance-learning technology to promote learning. The department has estimated that Wisconsin public schools spent approximately \$11,500,000 in FY01 on professional development related to all aspects of educational technology. If this bill were effective in the 2000-01 school year, it could have increased the amount needed for the state to meet its commitment to fund two-thirds of partial school revenues by a maximum of approximately \$7.7 million (\$11.5 million X 2/3).

State Fiscal Effect:

Because it is probable that not all money spent by local districts for staff development related to educational technology was for teaching professional staff in the use of digital technology and distance-learning technology to promote learning, the actual amount needed for the state to meet its two-thirds funding commitment would have been less than \$7,670,500. The amount needed to maintain the state's funding commitment is therefore indeterminate.

Local Fiscal Effect:

Local school districts could realize an increase in revenue limit authority as a result of this bill. If school districts had spent \$11,500,000 in teaching professional staff how to use digital technology and distance-education technology, local property taxes could have increased by a maximum of \$3,829,500 (\$11.5 million X 1/3) in FY01 on a statewide basis.
