Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, a filer may claim a school property tax/rent credit for property taxes (or rent constituting property taxes) paid during the taxable year for which the return relates. The credit currently is equal to 12% of the first \$2,500 of property taxes paid (\$1,250 for married separate filers). No credit was available in tax year 1999; in tax year 1998, the credit was equal to 14% of the first \$2,500 (\$1,250 for married couples filing separately) of property taxes; and in tax years beginning before January 1, 1998, the credit was equal to 10% of the first \$2,000 of property taxes paid (\$1,000 for married separate filers).

This bill allows filers to claim the school property tax credit either in one year for property taxes paid in two taxable years (if the claimant does not claim in one year the credit for that year), or for the year to which the property taxes relate if the claimant pays property taxes for two taxable years in one year.

A comparison of school property tax/rent credit claims for tax years 1997 and 1998 indicates that approximately 70,000 filers claimed the credit in only one of those two years. Thus, it is assumed that, on average, 35,000 filers claim the credit in every other year. Allowing these filers to claim the credit for taxes paid in two years would allow these filers to claim an additional \$2.8 million in credits annually. After adjusting for the change in the calculation of the credit that took effect for tax years 2000 and thereafter as a result of 1999 Wisconsin Act 198, the revenue loss is estimated to be \$3.0 million annually.
