Transfer of Class A bear hunting licenses to minors						

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary:

This bill allows a person who is issued a Class A bear license to transfer that license to a person who is at least 12 years old but under the age of 18. The minor may then use the license to pursue, bait, and hunt bear as authorized by a Class A bear license. The bill allows both residents and nonresidents to transfer Class A bear licenses and allows both resident and non-resident minors to be the transferees. No fee in addition to the original fee paid by the transferor of the license is required except that if a resident transfers a license to a nonresident minor, the resident must pay a fee equal to the difference between the fees for the nonresident and resident license, or \$160. There is no rebate of the fee if a nonresident transfers a license to a resident minor.

Fiscal Estimate:

This bill can be implemented by creating application materials that would enable the person transferring the bear hunting license to do so at the time of original application via the Automated License Issuance System (ALIS). If transferring a resident license to a nonresident, the transferor would submit the \$160 fee (the difference between the \$41 resident license and the \$201 nonresident license); otherwise the application would be for informational purposes only. If not done at the time of application, the transfer could be done at a later date (up to August 1) through a manual process.

This bill would have minimal fiscal impact, depending on its effective date. If the bill takes effect in the 2003 license year and passes with enough time for the department to integrate the necessary changes into the other 2003 licensing changes, the cost would be \$5,000 or less. This cost would be several times higher if the department had to implement it in the 2002 license year as a special programming change. In any case, the number of transfers is likely to create only a small workload increase.

The amount of additional revenue to the department will be minimal. The only time the \$160 fee would apply would be when a resident adult license holder transfers his or her license to a nonresident minor. Only 150 nonresidents purchased Class A bear licenses in license year 2001, and it is unlikely that more than a small handful, if any, of this type of transfer would occur.
