Author's reasoning for introducing legislation:
By request of a constituent.

Author's intent:
To eliminate a disparity that exists in Social Security payments made to individuals born between 1917 and 1926. Those that fall within these "Notch" years are at a financial disadvantage. House Resolution 97 would address this disparity. AJR 67 would recommend to Congress to pass HR97.
