

Moved by Senator Moen that the committee object, in part, to **Clearinghouse Rule 00-091**. The Senate Committee on Health, Utilities, Veterans and Military Affairs objects only to the following part of the proposed modification to Clearinghouse Rule 00-091 which was submitted to the Committee by the Department of Health and Family Services on June 6, 2001.

The language in proposed s. HFS 112.07(2)(u)1.a which states:

“If responding separately, the required crew members shall be simultaneously dispatched for responses to all prehospital emergency transports and intercepts. A single paramedic, licensed registered nurse, licensed physician assistant, or physician performing in the staffing configuration specified in this subdivision paragraph may perform all of the skills authorized under s. HFS 112.04(4) for EMTs-paramedic prior to the arrival of a second paramedic, licensed registered nurse, licensed physician assistant, or physician, as long as arrival of the second paramedic, licensed registered nurse, licensed physician assistant, or physician is expected within a reasonable and prudent time. After the patient has been assessed and stabilized, one EMT-paramedic, licensed registered nurse, licensed physician assistant, or physician may be released by protocol or verbal order from a physician. Transport of the patient may then occur with one EMT-paramedic, licensed registered nurse, licensed physician assistant, or physician and, at a minimum, one EMT-basic. Ambulance services responding with


EMT-paramedics, licensed registered nurses, licensed physician assistants, or physicians from two different locations or who release one EMT-paramedic, licensed registered nurse, licensed physician assistant, or physician after assessment, shall describe in their operational plan how this staffing will take place to ensure a timely response and adequate care.”
