Subject: Summary of Developments during my tenure on Tech College Board

Dear Ms. Moen:

I'm disappointed that the Senate Education Committee hearing date on the 12th is not working out. As I mentioned in my reply earlier today, the 26th is also out due to a Board meeting already scheduled away from Madison. The 12th would still work for me at anytime during the day as would the following Wednesday the 19th. Also October 3rd.

Attached is a brief summary of developments and initiatives that took place during my tenure on the Tech College System Board. Feel free to distribute this to committee members. I am by no means the only contributing Board member to these accomplishments: I'd first give a great deal of the credit to former Chair Del DeLong for pushing to make more 'system' in the system and to bring a heightened sense of cooperation among the districts. Others, such as Anne Reid and Jim Elliot and Al Schrafnagel did much as well. But I did my share and spanned the entire period as a continuously serving board member. I am proud of our Technical College System and believe that I am ready to continue my efforts towards making it stronger.

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**Wisconsin Technical College System Board
Selected Developments During the Tenure of Jonathan Barry
1989 – 2001**

Focus on the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS)

- Promoted identity as a System for postsecondary technical education in Wisconsin.
- Developed increased public accountability of the WTCS through the first systemwide model for institutional effectiveness for a public, two-year, postsecondary educational system in the United States.
- WTCS adopted a customer focus to better meet the needs of students and employers.
- Promoted partnerships between the WTCS and business and industry, labor, the University of Wisconsin System and independent colleges, K-12 education, and state agencies to better integrate vocational, technical and adult education with other education, training and economic development initiatives.
- Increased the visibility of the WTCS and technical education across Wisconsin through statewide marketing.
- Promoted greater efficiency and effectiveness in the WTCS by encouraging shared programming and curriculum development, benchmarking of best practices, and cooperative purchasing.
- Developed policies and procedures to foster distance education through the development of telecommunications networks and Internet usage.
- Obtained statutory change to rename the system to the Wisconsin Technical College System to better reflect its current mission.
- Supported development and implementation of the Wisconsin Leadership Development Institute to train future technical college leaders.
- Increased awareness of the need for leadership by women and minorities in the WTCS.
- Acquired categorical aid to start new programs in high labor need industries and add sections of filled courses.

Focus on Students

- Developed a guarantee that technical college graduates will have the skills they need for entry-level employment in occupations related to their field of study or will be retrained at no cost to the student or employer.
- Abolished interdistrict tuition.
- Added student member to the State Board.
- Developed baccalaureate completion programs with the University of Wisconsin System for Associate Degree graduates.
- Secured funding to improve services to minority students to improve retention.
- Coordinated and collaborated with the Department of Workforce Development at the state and local level to provide employment and training program clients with seamless access to education, employment and short-term training services through a system of nationally recognized One-Stop Job Centers.
- Helped design and implement statewide a nationally recognized Youth Apprenticeship program with a strong emphasis on postsecondary vocational-technical education.
- Expanded postsecondary options for high school students in lieu of high school attendance.
- Provided high school students with clearer pathways to postsecondary education and training by supporting WTCS efforts to greatly expand the articulation of high school and technical college curriculum.
- Developed uniform policy on credit for prior learning.
- Effectively advocated for increased awareness and funding to meet the needs of the growing proportion of WTCS students who are academically or economically disadvantaged, with limited English proficiency, or who are disabled.
- Developed new on-line Student Information System, including registration and financial aid information.
- Implemented TOP Grant Program.

Focus on Curriculum and Instructional Delivery

- Helped develop the computer-based Wisconsin Instructional Design System (WIDS) to provide a systematic approach to the design and development of curriculum.
- Fostered movement toward greater commonality and consistency of instruction systemwide through core curriculum projects.
- Approved associate degree program in technical studies to provide journey workers with academic recognition for technical college studies.
- Increased work-based learning components in all associate degree programs.
- Fostered efforts to increase customized training and to develop credit-based continuing education courses, advanced technical certificates, and short-term certificate programs to encourage incumbent worker and workforce entrants to upgrade technical skills.
- Initiated a review and assessment of adult basic education programs in the WTCS to guide the development and strengthening of the delivery of basic skills education within the WTCS.
- Enhanced adult basic education in the WTCS by providing support and funding for new curriculum, personal education plans, increased use of technology and cooperative initiatives with volunteers.
- Encouraged the widespread adoption of new information technologies in the WTCS by establishing the Governor's Educational Technology Conference in partnership with the University of Wisconsin system, the Department of Public Instruction, the Educational Communications Board, and the Governor's Office.
- Acquired new categorical aid program to train teachers in electronic delivery of instruction.
- Developed partnership with Cisco Systems to teach Cisco certification courses.
- Developed partnership with UW System and Department of Defense on distance learning Co-Lab.
- Implemented WTCS participation in TEACH program.

Focus on Business, Industry and Labor

- Led the Governor's Commission for a Quality Workforce to identify the skill needs of Wisconsin business and industry and to develop initiatives to upgrade the skills of the incumbent workforce and improve the educational preparation of future workers.
- Established and funded a nationally recognized system of workplace literacy centers in cooperation with the Wisconsin State AFL-CIO and Wisconsin Manufacturers and Commerce.
- Established, with a coalition of leaders from business and industry, labor, government, and education, the Wisconsin Manufacturing Extension Partnership to assist the state's 10,000 small to mid-sized manufacturers with technology transfer and business modernization; obtained state and federal funding to support these efforts.
- Advanced district contracting to deliver services to business and industry.

Focus on the State Board

- Advocated greater Board leadership of the WTCS.
- Enhanced State Board policy focus and developed System Vision and Strategic Directions.
- Increased State Board's involvement and consultation in facilities approval through adoption of long-range facility planning and the development of a two-phase review process for district facilities projects.
- Promoted re-engineering of internal agency program, course and grant approval process.


