As part of the state effort to look at the P-5 Program, all second and fifth graders in P-5 schools were administered a writing sample. Each second grade student received a common prompt and was asked to write a descriptive essay. Each fifth grade student received a common prompt and was asked to write a persuasive essay. Each theme was scored by two independent readers who rated the essay on a 1-4 scale. The scores were totaled to obtain the student score. When two scorers disagreed by more than one point, a third reader rated the essay and that score was combined with the other agreeing score.

Table I presents the second grade results. Racine scored lower than the overall program mean and there was some range of scores between the individual schools. Five schools scored lower than the overall program average; only one school scored higher. Two schools scored lower than the district average. The fifth grade results are presented in Table II. Racine scored slightly higher than the overall program mean. Four schools scored below the overall program and district means and two schools scored above the program and district means.

All third graders in Wisconsin public schools took the Wisconsin Reading Comprehension Test in the spring of 2000. Based on performance standards set by DPI, all students were categorized by level of performance on the test. Results of the testing are reported in Table III. Five of the six schools had over fifty percent of the students scoring at the Proficient or higher level of performance. One school scored above the district and the state.

The results for the 4th Grade 1999-2000 Wisconsin Knowledge and Concepts Examination are presented in Table IV.A. - IV.E. Students were tested in reading, language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies.

Standardized test results are reported for each individual P-5 school, all P-5 schools together, and the entire District in Tables V-XII. These results are for grades one, four and five. Locally written Diagnostic Reading and/or Math tests were administered to grades one, two, three and five. The results from these tests are reported in Tables XIII - XX.

Racine district-wide writing assessment is reported in Tables XXI and XXII. At grade two the P-5 schools' average is slightly lower than the District's score. At grade five the P-5 schools' average is slightly lower than the District's score.

Tables XXIII - XXVI report poverty, attendance, mobility, and suspension rates. Poverty rates among P-5 schools ranged from 48.9% to 86.9% with an average of 67.3%. There was very little variability in attendance rates; all schools' rates were above 92%. Mobility rates ranged from 10.5% to 29.9% with an average of 17.9%. Suspension rates ranged from 0.00% to 0.21% with an average of 0.09%.

APPENDIX H P-5 STUDENT SUCCESS STORY

A Student Success Story

Beginning the Accelerated Reading Program for Grades 2-5 with funding from P-5 and Title I was a positive decision for School A students.

John Doe is a young man in a third grade class at School A. Although John has been diagnosed ADHD, he has been allowed to participate fully in a classroom with his peers.

As a second grader, daily work in reading was a struggle for John. He had a difficult time focusing and completing assigned work in a timely fashion. He received above satisfactory grades but he was not working up to his potential.

In third grade, his teacher supported 110% the Accelerated Reading Program. John tested at 1.7 as an average reading level. May 2000, he tested at a 2.8 average reading level. He is currently reading at a 3.9-4.3 grade level and scoring between 80% and 90% on accompanying tests.

His classroom behavior is very erratic. He has good days with more bad days. However, when he is given the opportunity to help in the Accelerated Reading room, his behavior is exemplary. He helps the assistant with many details involved with the program. He looks forward to helping out and this has become an incentive for improved classroom behavior.

How has P-5 benefited John? Additional staffing, money for incentives, and the Accelerated Reading Program materials have all played an important part in the success story behind John Doe.
