Dear Senator Breske,

I am writing to respectfully request a public hearing and executive session on Assembly Bill 63 in the Senate Committee on Insurance, Tourism and Transportation.

AB 63, commonly referred to as the "Miss & Run" bill, modifies current law to make the actions that must be undertaken in a "hit & run" accident also apply to the operator of a vehicle which is involved in a "miss & run." This bill closes a gap in current law that allows an individual who has caused an accident, but whose vehicle has failed to make contact, to escape responsibility for that accident. Penalties are provided, but are reduced from the penalties prescribed for "hit and run."

The Assembly passed a similar bill during the 1999-2000 session. 2001-2002 Assembly Bill 63 has been amended to address earlier concerns about how an operator of a vehicle would know he or she caused an accident.

I am available to answer any questions you may have about this legislation and urge you to schedule a prompt hearing on AB 63.
