Re: Support For AB 249

The League of Wisconsin Municipalities supports AB 249, which clarifies the number of "Class B" liquor licenses a municipality may issue under its statutory quota after annexing territory containing licensed premises. The bill passed the Assembly on November 1 by voice vote. AB 249 restores statutory language that was likely inadvertently repealed when the reserve "Class B" liquor license and the minimum \$10,000 initial issuance fee was created by 1997 Wisconsin Act 27.

Since that time, cities, villages and towns have been operating under a cloud of uncertainty regarding the status of licensed premises annexed into cities and villages. Because of the lack of statutory guidance, questions have arisen in a number of instances as to whether a licensed establishment that has been annexed into a municipality having no regular or reserve "Class B" liquor licenses available may continue to operate after its license from the town expires. AB 249 is necessary because it clarifies that a municipality's liquor license quota will increase by the number of licensed premises in the territory that has been annexed.

The League urges you to support recommending concurrence of AB 249. Thanks for considering the interests of municipalities on this issue.
