RE: Funding Changes in 2001 Senate Bill 272, Relating to a Community Youth Grant to the Wisconsin Chapters of the Boys and Girls Club of America

DATE: October 16, 2001

This memorandum discusses the provisions of 2001 Senate Bill 272, relating to a community youth grant to the Wisconsin Chapters of the Boys and Girls Club of America, and the effect of the changes on Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) funding. Senate Bill 272 was introduced by you; cosponsored by Representative Krawczyk on October 10, 2001. The bill has been referred to the Senate Committee on Labor and Agriculture, which has scheduled a public hearing on the bill for October 17, 2001.

Background

Under current law, a portion of TANF funding is allocated to the community youth grant program. The community youth grant program is a competitive grant program administered by the Department of Workforce Development (DWD) to fund programs that improve social, academic and employment skills for youth whose family's income is at or below 200% of the federal poverty level.

The biennial budget bill, 2001 Senate Bill 55, allocated \$7,579,700 for fiscal year 2001-02 and \$500,000 for fiscal year 2002-03 for community youth grants. [s. 49.175 (1) (z), Stats.] Of this funding, \$500,000 was earmarked for the Wisconsin Chapters of the Boys and Girls Clubs of America for each year of the biennium. [SECTION 9158 (8x), 2001 Wis. Act 16.]

The Governor partially vetoed the overall funding allocation for community youth grants for the second year of the biennium so that under 2001 Wisconsin Act 16, the Biennial Budget Act, \$50,000 is allocated to community youth grants for fiscal year 2002-03. Also, as a result of a partial veto, Act 16 earmarks \$50,000 for each fiscal year to the Wisconsin Chapters of the Boys and Girls Club of America. Therefore, for fiscal year 2001-02, the funding for community youth grants remains the same, but the amount that is earmarked for the Boys and Girls Club is reduced from \$500,000 to \$50,000. The remaining \$450,000 is available for other community youth grants. For fiscal year 2002-03, the funding

for community youth grants in general is decreased from \$500,000 to \$50,000, as is the amount earmarked for the Boys and Girls Club for that year. The \$450,000 that was taken from the community youth grant allocation for fiscal year 2002-03 remains in the TANF appropriation but is not currently allocated to a specific purpose or program.*

2001 Senate Bill 272

Senate Bill 272 restores the funding for community youth grants and the Boys and Girls Club to the amount proposed to be allocated by the Legislature. Therefore, under the bill, in fiscal year 2002-03, \$500,000 in TANF funding is allocated to community youth grants. Further, in each year of the biennium, \$500,000 of the community youth grant funding is earmarked for the Boys and Girls Club. Because the Governor did not reduce the total amount of TANF funding, the bill does not increase TANF funding, but instead allocates \$450,000 currently held in unallotted reserves to the community youth grant program and earmarks that money for the Boys and Girls Club.

Comment

As discussed above, the bill does not require additional TANF funding in order to increase funding to the Boys and Girls Club. Therefore, SECTION 3 of the bill, which increases TANF funding in the amount of \$450,000, should be deleted through an amendment to the bill.

* The TANF funding amounts in the budget were based on the assumption that approximately \$723,000 in TANF moneys, including the \$450,000 remaining after the partial veto of the funding for community youth grants, will be available at the end of the biennium. However, DWD has not yet calculated the ending balance for fiscal year 2000-01, so the ending balance may be less than anticipated.



On behalf of the 1500 children in Targeted Outreach Programs at Boys & Girls Clubs at 26 locations, I want to thank you for having the hearing on SB 272. The bill authorizes \$500,000 in each year of the biennium to continue the program that has helped so many at-risk kids in the first 21 months of its existence.

Targeted Outreach has been successful in keeping at-risk kids out of further trouble. Over 40% of the participants were referred by law enforcement, schools or concerned family members for this remedial intervention. The goal of the program is to make sure these kids are making appropriate decisions about the use of their time and the friends they have. Mainstreaming them in Boys & Girls Clubs programs achieves the goal of not only providing these kids with a safe place to be after school, it also has assured them of not falling back into bad habits which take them back into the law enforcement arena.

A component of a successful program is measuring that success. Boys & Girls Clubs in the State work with UW-Milwaukee Center for Urban Initiatives and Research to provide analysis which show the money that has been spent on Targeted Outreach achieves the goals of the program as created by the Legislature and required of TANF spending. I would be happy to provide more detail than the attached charts show if you would like.

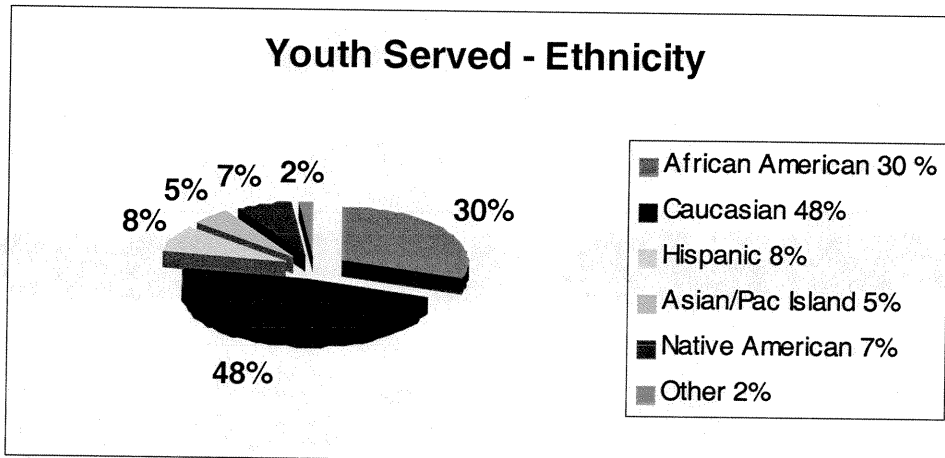
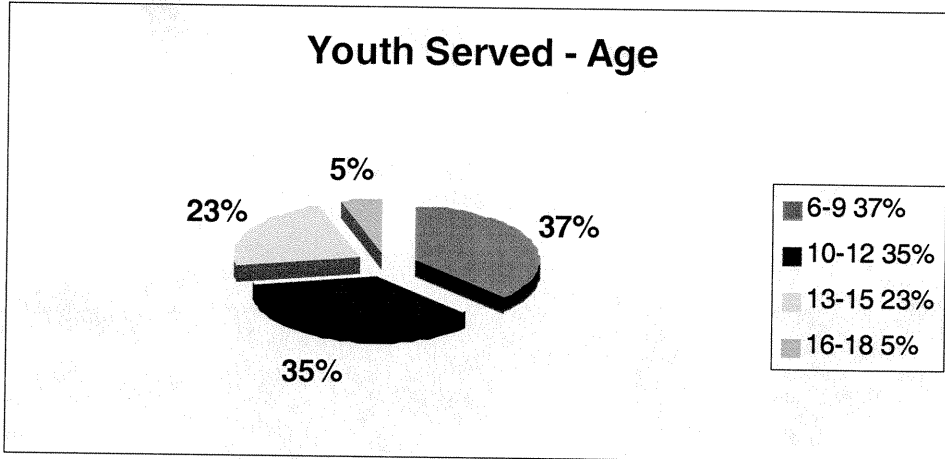

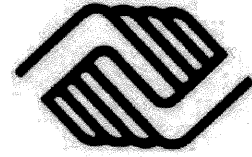

- A. Expected outcomes were far surpassed as **1,935** children of parents who live in poverty were assured a safe place during non-school hours.
- B. TANF eligible families in 26 neighborhoods (19 cities and villages) received specific guidance and **1,554** youth remain active in the program.

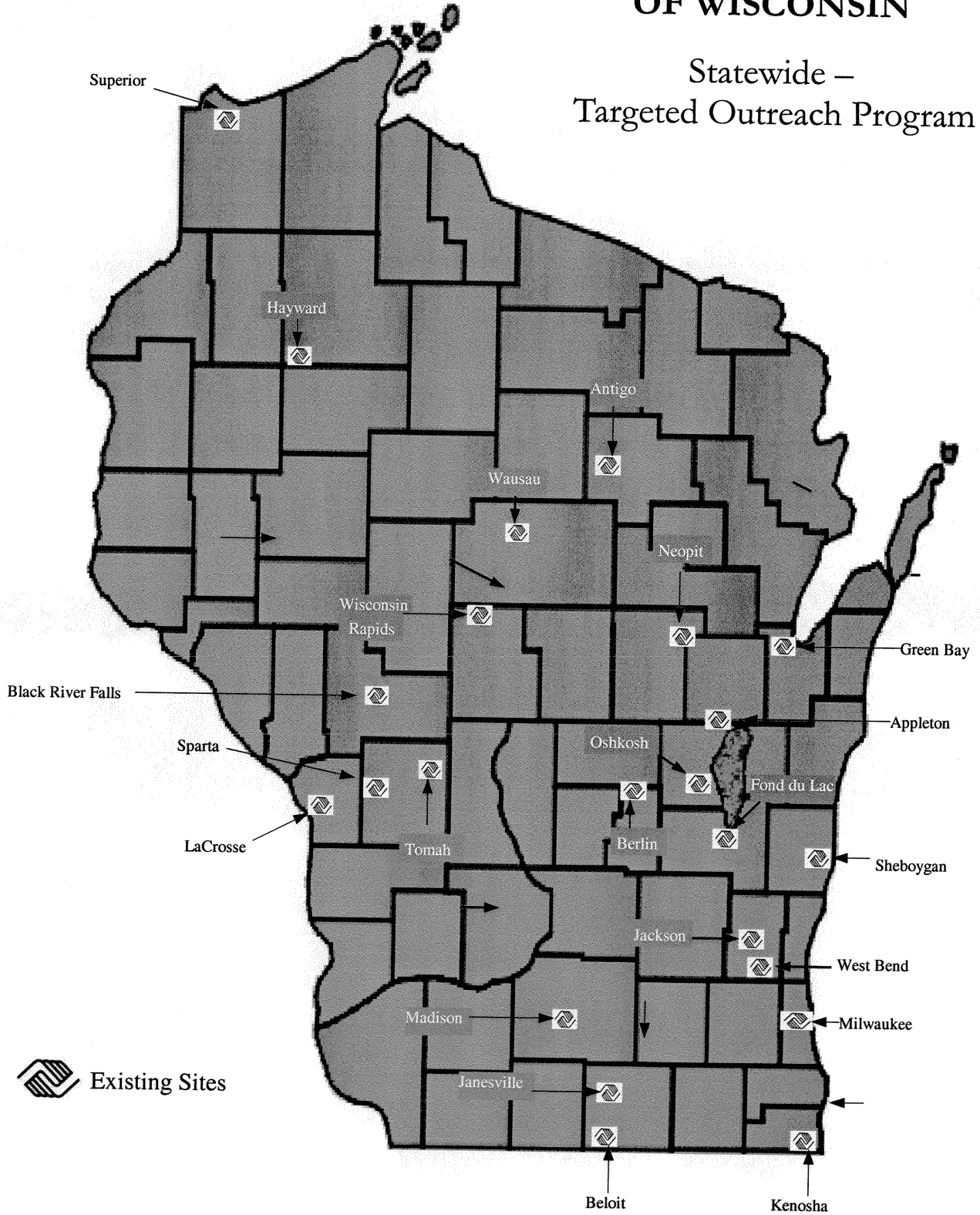


1. Most children attend the Club daily and the rest participate at least twice a week.
2. **41%** of participants were referred by law enforcement, schools, or family members for remedial intervention
3. The targeted outreach initiative proved successful in leveraging major national support for the development of state of the art technology centers in each Clubhouse in the State.
4. Tutoring, computer access, sports and arts & crafts rank highest in youth participation.
