**RE:** Applicable Salary Level for Office of Lieutenant Governor

**DATE:** March 28, 2001

By letter dated March 21, 2001, you requested of Terry Anderson, Director, clarification on the appropriate salary level for Senator Farrow if she were to be confirmed as Lieutenant Governor. This memorandum responds to your request.

Under current law, the annual salary of the Lieutenant Governor is to be set at 1.9% above the minimum of the salary range for Executive Salary Group 4. [s. 20.923 (2) (g), Stats.] The current salary rate for Office of Lieutenant Governor is \$63,672 per year. [See s. B-2.03 (2) of the Wisconsin Compensation Plan 1999-2001.] Generally, a person appointed to fill the Office of Lieutenant Governor would be assigned the above salary. However, s. 13.04 (4), Stats., limits the salary of legislators elected or appointed to other state civil offices or positions if the compensation or other emoluments of the office to which they are elected or appointed were increased during the term of the legislator. Section 13.04 (4), Stats., provides that:

Any incumbent member of the legislature who, during the term for which the member was elected to the legislature, by appointment or election assumes any judicial office or state civil office or position for which the compensation or other emoluments were increased during the member's current legislative term by legislative action, or by any other official action requiring the assent of or subject to veto by the legislature, shall be entitled to the compensation or other emoluments for such office or position only at the rate in effect prior to such increase.

Senator Farrow was elected to her current term as Senator in November 1998. Her term began in January 1999. At that time, the rate of pay for the Office of Lieutenant Governor was \$60,183 per year. The Joint Committee on Employment Relations (JCOER) effectively approved two increases to that rate of pay during Senator Farrow's current term. By action of JCOER on June 9, 1999, and May 2, 2000, the minimum of the salary range applicable to Executive Salary Group 4 was increased, thereby

increasing the rate of pay for the Office of Lieutenant Governor. Accordingly, if Senator Farrow were to be confirmed as Lieutenant Governor, it is arguable that s. 13.04 (4), Stats., would limit her compensation to that provided for the Office of Lieutenant Governor prior to the increases occurring during her term. Under that interpretation, she would be limited to \$60,183 per year.

However, this interpretation is not completely free from doubt. One might argue that the action of a single committee, i.e., JCOER, is not the "legislative action" or "other official action" referred to in s. 13.04 (4), Stats. Such an argument would posit that the purpose of s. 13.04 (4), Stats., is to prohibit legislators from benefiting from a self-enacting pay increase [see 63 Op. Att'y. Gen. 136.1] and that Senator Farrow, who was not a member of JCOER during her current term, did not vote on the action that lead to the increase in the pay for the Lieutenant Governor's position and, thus, should not be prohibited from receiving the higher salary. This argument appears to be buttressed by statutes that expound on the duties of JCOER. For example, s. 230.12 (1) (bf), Stats., provides that any provision of the compensation plan approved by JCOER which requires "legislative action for implementation" must be introduced by JCOER in a bill or companion bills. Similarly, s. 111.92 (1) (a), Stats., provides that when JCOER approves a tentative collective bargaining agreement it is required to introduce a bill or companion bills for that portion of the agreement which "requires legislative action for implementation." Accordingly, it may be argued that s. 13.04 (4), Stats., contemplated action by the entire Legislature and not just a single committee such as JCOER.

Notwithstanding the above argument, it would seem that the purposes for which s. 13.04 (4), Stats., was created would be furthered by construing the provision to apply to action by JCOER. Generally, JCOER is made up of the legislative leadership from both houses and acts on behalf of the Legislature. [See s. 13.111, Stats.] When JCOER does introduce bills requiring "legislative action," it must generally accompany the introduction of such proposal with a message that informs the Legislature of JCOER's concurrence and recommendation for the passage of the legislation without change. [See e.g., ss. 230.12 (1) (bf) and 111.92 (1) (a), Stats.] A legislator, though not specifically voting on a proposal before JCOER, may nonetheless use the power and influence of his or her office to influence the action of JCOER. Additionally, had the Legislature wanted to limit the applicability of s. 13.04 (4), Stats., to matters upon which a member had voted, it could easily have done so in specific terms. Thus, it appears that to conclude that the reference to "legislative action" or "other official action" in s. 13.04, Stats., applies to actions by JCOER would be consistent with the intent of s. 13.04 (4), Stats., and the realities of legislative practice.

Because the interpretation of s. 13.04 (4), Stats., as it applies to your question, is not free from doubt, you may wish to seek the opinions of the Governor and the Attorney General on the appropriate salary level for Senator Farrow if she is confirmed as Lieutenant Governor.

**I am very pleased to have the opportunity to testify at today's confirmation hearing for Senator Margaret Farrow. She has been a good friend and strong supporter of innovative and creative programs for UW-Stout. In fact, through her tireless effort we were able to obtain a new initiative this biennium that supports a critical sector of Wisconsin's economy, the Printing Industry.**

**This industry ships about \$5.3 billion in orders annually. The State ranks 8<sup>th</sup> among the 50 states in both the number of printing establishments and in printing employment. Further, the industry has provided about \$2 million in support for UW-Stout over the past decade.**

**The University of Wisconsin System and the Technical College System are engines that drive the new economy. Senator Farrow recognizes that, working closely together, these educational partners are even more effective. Therefore, when the Printing Industry expressed a concern about the need for more college graduates with a bachelor's degree in graphic communications management, she supported an initiative that brought these partners together to develop a solution. Without the additional graduates, growth of the industry would be seriously impaired. Because the market for new students within the traditional delivery system had been exhausted, there was a need to reach new markets.**

**This initiative is unique. It is new, innovative, and forward looking, and that is why Senator Farrow supported it so strongly. The new program brought together Sussex High School, the Waukesha Technical College and UW-Stout. This is an excellent example of seamless education. Students focus on graphics in high school (with, of course, their core**

**academic programs), transfer to the technical college for an associate's degree, and then to UW-Stout to complete the degree. Importantly, we deliver the program in Waukesha through various forms of distance technology or face-to-face instruction.**

**Beyond that, the Printing Industry of Wisconsin became a strong partner in this effort. Thus, we have been able to leverage strong State support to obtain generous assistance from the private sector.**

Regarding: your aspiration to become Lt. Governor

Dear Margaret:

*as chairman of the Government Operations  
Committee you should be aware of this.*

I believe in certain matters you have failed to faithfully represent your constituents, thus far, and I fear you will continue to do so regardless of what political office you hold.

You cite your long years of service as the most important aspect of your qualifications and ask those you wish to represent to disregard your voting records. (Journal Sentinel - Richard Jones 3/22/01). Impossible. What other final purpose is there for a public official but to vote? How else can constituents judge the official's effectiveness but on the record of her or his votes?

You do have an impressive record of public service, but also disservice.

1) Your vote to obligate and appropriate \$740 million of taxpayer money to build and support the Milwaukee County Stadium and Milwaukee Brewer Baseball Club was an inexcusable disservice to your constituents.

2) Your inability and failure to right the grievous wrong the state of Wisconsin has imposed on its veterans of World War II, and the Korean and Vietnam Wars is another \$700 million disservice to the people you want to represent, whether they be veteran or taxpayer.

These are the two hot button issues that stick in my mind when I judge Margaret Farrow's political accomplishments. You failed me in both instances.

On the stadium: I consider it a sad commentary on our political institution when the only Wisconsin state senator ever recalled and thrown out of office for betraying his constituents is portrayed as a hero to our children.

On the veteran recognition issue: Your refusal to use your office to right the wrong can not be excused. Since 1972, at the same time you were becoming involved in Elm Grove politics, your state has;

1) passed unconstitutional veterans' laws violating both the Wisconsin and U.S. Constitutions,

2) permitted public officials to use their public office for substantial unlawful personal gain and unjust enrichment,

3) permitted votes to be cast prohibited by Wisconsin criminal statutes,

4) obligated approximately \$700 million for personal bonuses for about 45,000 pre 1974 U.S. military service veterans; regardless of whether their armed forces service was during peacetime or wartime, and regardless of what state their military service originated in.

\* THE \$700MILLION IN UNLAWFUL VETERAN BENEFIT PAYMENTS PRESENTLY \*  
\* BEING MADE FROM DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYEE TRUST FUND MONEY PROVIDES NO \*  
\* PUBLIC BENEFIT OR SERVICE TO WISCONSIN RESIDENTS. \*

I first made you aware of the veteran issue in 1993 when you became my senator through redistricting. In the seven years since, you have failed to make any serious attempt to right this grievous wrong and waste of taxpayer money. Unlike the stadium where the damage is already done, you can still correct the veteran bonus problem if you have the will to do it. WILL YOU DO IT MARGARET?

Your political credentials are certainly laudable and impressive. Your 30 years of public service include -- Elm Grove public official 1971-87. Wisconsin Assembly 1986-89. Wisconsin Senate 1989-2001. Committees you served on in the state legislature directly related to the veteran issue are; Aging - Veterans - Joint Audit - Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems - Retirement Research Council - Save Commission - Civil Service Reform - Government Effectiveness - and Joint Finance. You are evidently knowledgeable in fiscal matters so you cannot escape responsibility for doing nothing to;

- 1) Pay a cash bonus to all legitimate Wisconsin veterans of WWII, and the Korean and Vietnam Wars, and to pay for it by
- 2) repealing the unlawful state statutes s.41.09 (3)(c) and s.40.02 (15)(c) veteran bonus, and
- 3) save Wisconsin taxpayers several hundred million dollars by doing so.



--State Sen. Margaret Farrow received her first Senate committee scrutiny today. She received criticism for her conservative views from state Rep. Terese Berceau and others. Berceau, D-Madison, ripped Farrow for her poor record on issues concerning labor, the environment, health care for the elderly, and abortion rights for women. "It's not an Alice in Dairyland contest," Berceau said. "She's getting by on personality, because there's not a constituency she's supported there." But Berceau conceded Farrow will get confirmed. Farrow claimed the session went generally well, stressed that lawmakers know her, and said she should be judged on her "competency to govern." She said her opponents focused on her "pro-life" views, adding: "I'm concerned about the unborn women as well as unborn men." Sen. Mark Meyer's committee is due to vote April 25 on Farrow with a full Senate vote in May.

--WEAC launched its first TV ad in the DPI race today in Madison, Milwaukee and Green Bay. WEAC, supporting Elizabeth Burmaster, wouldn't release a text of its ad. But a spokeswoman said it mentions Burmaster's qualifications while also talking about Linda Cross' poor tax-paying record. WEAC later said Cross, listed as operations manager for Chain of Lakes Marine, has been served 24 different times with delinquent tax warrants from the Department of Revenue. WEAC said the most recent two were for failure to pay unemployment taxes.

The Cross campaign called the ad a violation of Burmaster's Feb. 23 clean campaign pledge and said "the business in question has never been fined for not making a payment nor is in arrears on any payment." Said Cross: "Shame on Elizabeth for breaking her vow."

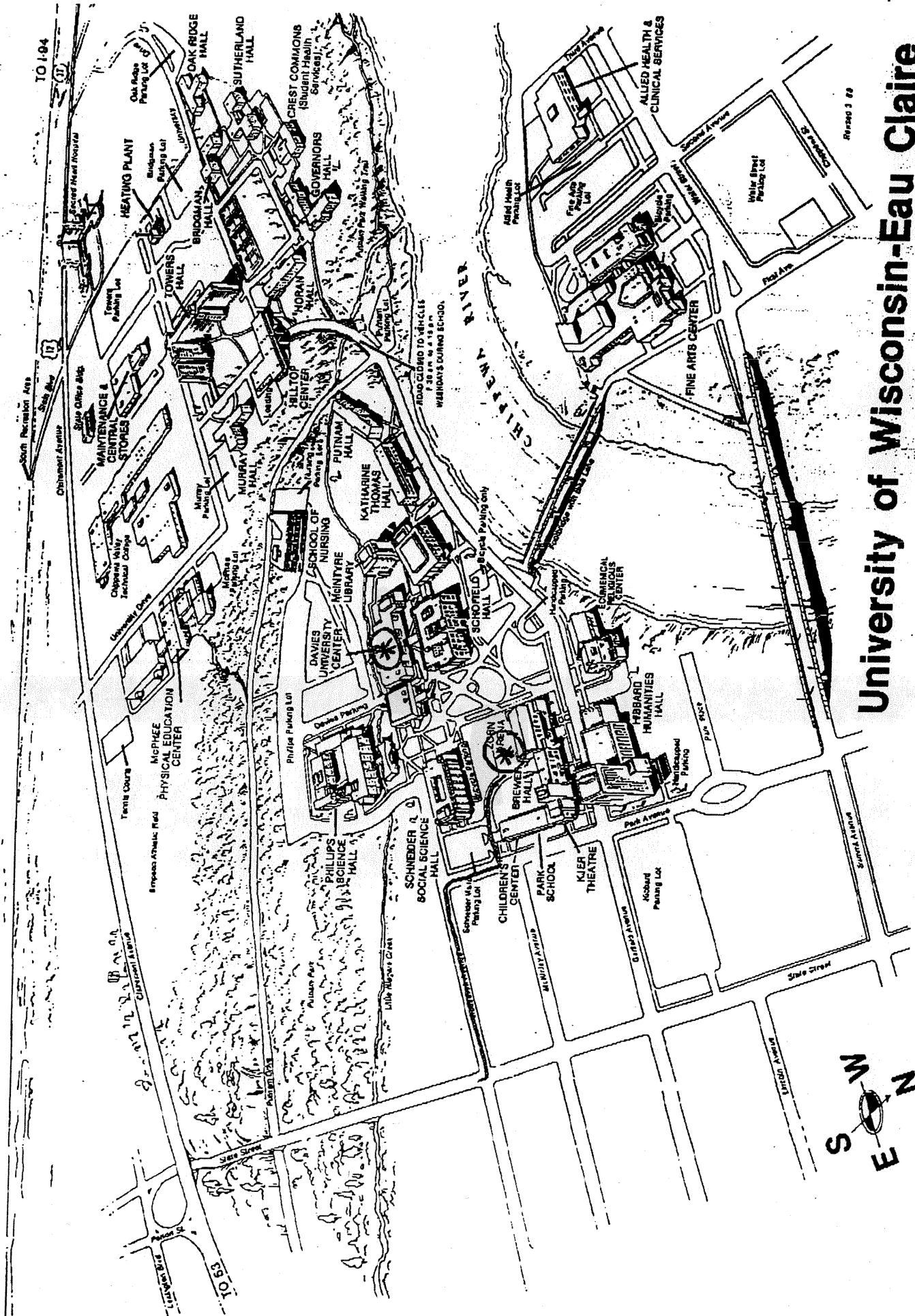

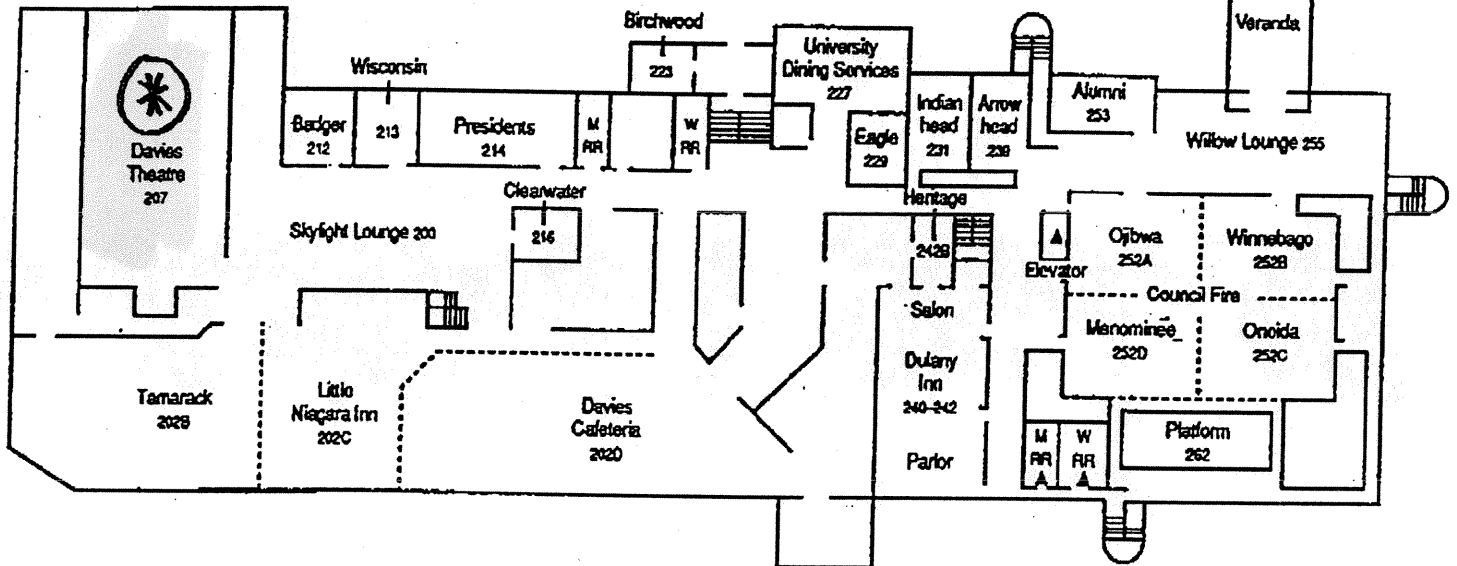

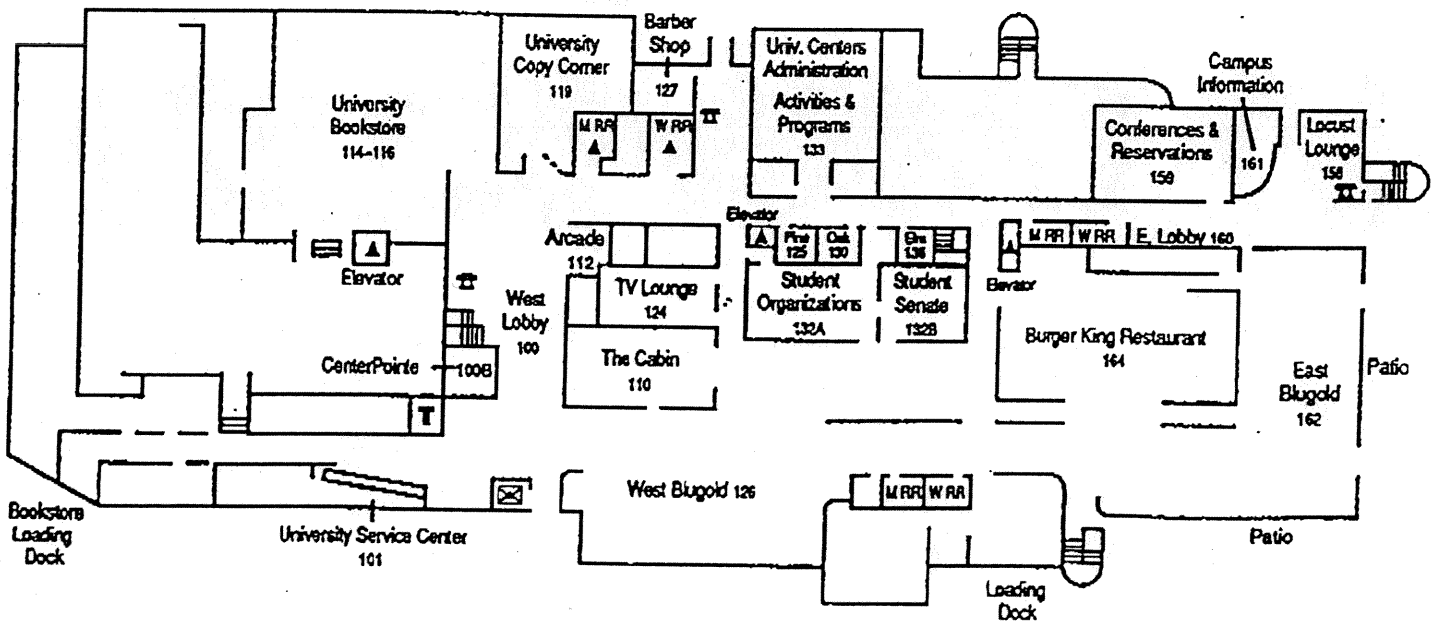

You recently received a request from the Senate Committee on Organization for an Attorney General's opinion. The request seeks an interpretation of Section 13.04(4) of the Statutes regarding the level of compensation I would receive once confirmed as Lieutenant Governor. As both a member of the Senate Committee on Organization and the Lieutenant Governor designate, I respectfully request an expeditious response on this matter.

The Senate Committee on Universities, Housing, and Government Operations, chaired by Senator Mark Meyer, has held two public hearings on the confirmation. Senator Meyer has publicly stated his intention to take executive action on the nomination on April 25. In addition, the Senate Committee on Organization is scheduled to meet on April 26 to establish a session calendar for May 1.

Since the amount of my salary as Lieutenant Governor has been questioned, Senators may wish to know your interpretation of the relevant Statutes prior to voting on my confirmation in both Committee and on the Senate floor. Therefore, your opinion would be most welcomed if it could be rendered prior to April 25.

As this type of transition may occur again in Wisconsin's future, it is apparent that the intent of the Statutes should be clearly defined. In the meantime, I am willing to begin serving as Lieutenant Governor at the lower salary pending determination of the proper amount. The question of compensation should not be an issue that would delay confirmation of my appointment. Your timely response to the Senate Committee on Organization would ensure that such a delay does not occur.

Dear Governor McCallum:

As chair of the Senate Committee on Universities, Housing & Government Relations, I recently requested a clarification from the Legislative Council concerning the appropriate salary level for Senator Farrow if she were to be confirmed as Lieutenant Governor.

I have since received a response from Legislative Council, which interprets s. 13.04 (4) Stats., as limiting the compensation level to \$60,183. Enclosed for your review is a copy of the March 28th Legislative Council memo regarding this issue.

However, the March 28th Legislative Council memo also stated the following:

*“Because the interpretation of s.13.04 (4), Stats., as it applies to your question, is not free from doubt, you may wish to seek the opinions of the Governor and the Attorney General on the appropriate salary level for Senator Farrow if she is confirmed as Lieutenant Governor”.*

In response to that uncertainty I have already requested an Attorney General's opinion regarding the above state statutes.

Since the act of confirming a Lieutenant Governor is unprecedented in Wisconsin, I believe we must be absolutely clear in how we interpret these statutes. Therefore, I respectfully request an opinion from your office as well as to what the appropriate salary level for Senator Farrow would be if she were confirmed as Lieutenant Governor.

Thank you in advance for your assistance in this matter.
