

2003 ASSEMBLY BILL 93

February 20, 2003 – Introduced by Representatives OLSEN, BERCEAU, GIELOW, HINES, OTT, STASKUNAS and VAN ROY. Referred to Committee on Small Business.

1 **AN ACT** *to create* 167.08 of the statutes; **relating to:** requiring alarm systems
2 for sellers of firearms and providing a penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill prohibits any person from offering to sell firearms to the public, unless the place of business where the firearms are offered for sale is equipped with an electronic system that is designed to monitor the place of business for the presence of, detect and summon aid for, or issue an alarm as a result of, an unauthorized intrusion. The prohibition does not apply, however, to an individual who offers to sell firearms at his or her residence.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 **SECTION 1.** 167.08 of the statutes is created to read:
4 **167.08 Alarm systems for sellers of firearms. (1) DEFINITION.** In this
5 section, “firearm” means a weapon that is designed to act by force of gunpowder to
6 fire a projectile.
