JOINT RULE 63. **Reproduction of engrossed measures.** Upon the finding by the chief clerk of either house that a bill, joint resolution, resolution or major amendment thereto has been amended in the house of origin to a considerable degree, the chief clerk may instruct the legislative reference bureau to prepare and have reproduced an engrossed copy of the measure. If an elector claims to be registered but his or her name does not appear on the appropriate registration list, the elector must complete a certification of eligibility and present acceptable proof of residence in order to vote. In addition, an elector may be required to provide acceptable proof of residence even if registration is not required. If an elector is not able to present any required proof of residence, as an alternative, current law permits another qualified elector who resides in the same municipality to corroborate the elector's information.

Under the bill, the clerk or board of election commissioners must determine the validity of identification no later than the day after the election. The decision of the clerk or board of election commissioners is final and is not subject to review during the canvassing process or during any recount.

The bill also permits an elector who is eligible to obtain a Wisconsin identification card to obtain the card from DOT free of charge, if the elector specifically requests not to be charged.

In addition, the bill deletes the authority for an elector to utilize corroboration in order to register to vote or to vote on election day.


