Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law requires the Department of Commerce (Commerce) to set minimum specifications for gasoline, reformulated gasoline, and kerosene and authorizes Commerce to set minimum specifications for other types of fuel.

This bill requires Commerce to set, by rule, minimum specifications for automotive gasoline that prohibit automotive gasoline from containing more than 0.5%, by volume, of methyl tertiary—butyl ether (MTBE). This prohibition first applies on July 1, 2005. MTBE is a chemical compound that is added to gasoline, often to boost the gasoline's octane or to meet clean fuel oxygen requirements.

For further information see the *state* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.



SECTION 1. Nonstatutory provisions.

- (1) EMERGENCY RULE. Using the procedure under section 227.24 of the statutes, the department of commerce shall promulgate the rule described under section 168.04 (2) of the statutes, as created by this act, for the period before the permanent rule becomes effective, but not to exceed the period authorized under section 227.24 (1) (c) and (2) of the statutes. Notwithstanding section 227.24 (1) (a), (2) (b), and (3) of the statutes, the department is not required to provide evidence that promulgating a rule under this subsection as an emergency rule is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, or welfare and is not required to provide a finding of emergency for the rule promulgated under this subsection.
- (2) STATEMENT OF LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND PURPOSE. The legislature finds that methyl tertiary—butyl ether may contaminate ground water through various means, including leaking fuel storage tanks and pipelines, refueling spills, automobile accidents, and improper consumer disposal of gasoline. As a result of its odor and taste, methyl tertiary—butyl other can make drinking water supplies undrinkable. The purpose of section 168.04 (2) of the statutes, as created by this act, is to reduce or eliminate the instances of methyl tertiary—butyl ether contaminating ground water.
