

1 AN ACT to create 125.07 (3) (a) 13. of the statutes; relating to: the prohibition
2 against underage persons entering or being on any premises operating under
3 an alcohol beverage license.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person who has not reached the legal drinking age (21 years of age), and who is not accompanied by his or her parent, guardian, or spouse who has attained the legal drinking age, may not enter or be on any premises for which a license or permit for the retail sale of alcohol beverages has been issued. Current law also provides for various exceptions to this prohibition.

This bill allows an unaccompanied person who has not reached the legal drinking age to enter and remain in a banquet room on premises licensed to sell alcohol beverages at retail to attend a special event or gathering, such as a wedding reception or anniversary party, if certain conditions are met.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Dear Representatives Huebsch and Shilling and Senator Meyer:

At this time I am once again contacting each of you regarding the citations that were recently issued against the City Brewing Company Hospitality Center alleging that we are not allowed to have minors on the premises that are not accompanied by a parent, as a result of our obtaining a Class B liquor license. It has been a month since our first letter was sent out and we have not received any response. This matter is of great importance to the City Brewery and should be to you. We need to resolve these issues promptly so that the brewery can continue to operate its tours. Your prompt attention to this issue would be greatly appreciated.

As I had previously explained, the reason that City Brewery obtained a valid Class B liquor license was to open up the Hospitality Center as a necessary and vital reception hall to the community for booking weddings, banquets, etc. They are using this facility for those rented purposes along with continuing the use of this facility for its original purpose, brewery tours. However, as a result of the Class B liquor license, they are now unable to have minors on the premises even for brewery tours. We are attempting to resolve the issue of these citations and prevent the future issuance of unnecessary citations against this very vital business which clearly is a productive and necessary member of this community. However, this is but a temporary

solution with the City because of these licensure issues. The City of La Crosse and this brewery need your prompt assistance to fully resolve these issues.

We are once again specifically contacting you to propose an amendment to Section 125.07(3)(a)3. This provision currently governs underage and intoxicated persons; presence on licensed premises; possession; penalties. Section 125.07(3) deals with the presence of minors in places of sale and the penalty resulting therefrom. Section 125.07(3)(a)3. provides the following businesses an exemption to have minors present even though the businesses possess a Class B liquor license identical to our brewery: "hotels, drug stores, grocery stores, bowling centers, billiards centers having on the premises 12 or more billiards tables that are not designed for coin operation and that are eight feet or longer in length, indoor golf simulator facilities, service stations, vessels, cars operated by any railroad, regularly established athletic fields, outdoor volleyball courts that are contiguous to a licensed premises, stadiums, public facilities as defined in Section 125.51(5)(b)1.d. which are owned by a county or municipality or centers for the visual or performing arts." Therefore, these particular entities are currently exempted and allowed to have underage persons present on their facilities even with the sale of liquor so long as liquor is not specifically sold to these underage people.

Our brewery needs an exemption explicit within this statute just as these other groups have achieved. We are proposing that an additional exception be drafted and adopted by the legislature within this same statutory section to exempt all brewery hospitality centers that possess a valid Class B liquor license to allow minors under the age of 21 to have access to banquets and tours at these places of business so long as alcoholic beverages are not served to these underage persons.

We ask that you give this matter serious consideration and reply to us within five business days of your receipt of our letter, as to how we can further pursue this matter or resolve this current problem which is causing great concerns for the City Brewery Hospitality Center, which as you are well aware, is a much needed banquet facility and a very vital business for this community. If a meeting needs to be arranged to facilitate discussion, that can be accomplished.

We thank you for your consideration and look forward to your prompt response.
