Peggy:

The Senate Committee on Transportation and Information Infrastructure held a public hearing on AB 382. During that hearing, questions arose about the placement of the ID's of bus driver's and where they should be placed. Chairman Leibham, along with the author if the bill Representative Jeff Stone and fellow committee members felt that this was an item that needed to be addressed and clarified in the bill and that an amendment would be required.

Following is correspondence from Legislative Council attorney, Don Salm, who staffs the Committee regarding the intent of the proposed amendment:

"...my notes indicate that the suggested amendment was for the operator to display the ID card conspicuously on his or her person...."

I understand that this is short notice, but I would like to send this amendment out to Committee members today to be voted on via paper ballot.

If you are able, could you please draft the necessary language to address this issue. The amendment will be introduced as a Committee amendment and should be sent to me when drafted. I have spoken with Marsha Dake in Rep. Stone's office and they green-lighted our office to proceed with the amendment. I will be working with Marsha to ensure that the amendment addresses the Committee concerns and reflects their offices' legislative intent. Please let me know if this amendment can be drafted yet this morning.

2003 ASSEMBLY BILL 382

June 5, 2003 – Introduced by Representatives STONE, SINICKI, BERCEAU, GRONEMUS, GUNDERSON, GUNDRUM, HINES, JENSEN, KRAWCZYK, MCCORMICK, MORRIS, OTT, PETROWSKI, TAYLOR, TOWNSEND and VAN ROY, cosponsored by Senators DARLING, ROESSLER, CARPENTER and STEPP. Referred to Committee on Transportation.

1 AN ACT *to amend* 110.06 (title), 121.52 (1) (a), 121.52 (2) (c) and 343.12 (1); and
2 *to create* 110.06 (2m) and 343.12 (4) (a) 4. of the statutes; **relating to:** issuing
3 and displaying a school bus operator identification card.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person must obtain, in addition to a valid motor vehicle operator's license, special authorization from the Department of Transportation (DOT) to operate a school bus. Depending on the number of violations within a three-year period, a person who operates a school bus without special authorization may be fined not less than \$200 nor more than \$2,000 and imprisoned for not less than five days nor more than six months.

Also under current law, any photograph taken by DOT for an operator's license or an identification card is kept confidential, except for limited access to certain law enforcement officers for law enforcement purposes.

Under this bill, an owner of a school bus is required to issue an identification card, designed by DOT, that contains the name and photograph of the person who operates the school bus. The bill requires the operator to display prominently the identification card whenever he or she operates a school bus. Failure to do so will result in the same penalties as operating a school bus without proper authorization from DOT.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

1 **SECTION 1.** 110.06 (title) of the statutes is amended to read:

2 **110.06 (title) Rules; identification cards; school bus presale inspection;**
3 **penalties.**

4 **SECTION 2.** 110.06 (2m) of the statutes is created to read:

5 **110.06 (2m)** Any person who owns a motor vehicle that is used as a school bus
6 shall issue an identification card to the operator of the motor vehicle. The
7 identification card shall contain the name and a photograph of the operator. The
8 department shall, by rule, prescribe the form and additional content of the
9 identification card.

10 **SECTION 3.** 121.52 (1) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

11 **121.52 (1) (a)** Rules governing the design, construction, inspection, and
12 operation of school buses and the identification of school bus operators adopted by
13 the secretary of transportation under s. 110.06 (2) and (2m) shall by reference be
14 made part of any contract for the transportation of pupils.

15 **SECTION 4.** 121.52 (2) (c) of the statutes is amended to read:

16 **121.52 (2) (c)** The form of contract shall be prescribed by the department and
17 shall provide that all parties to the contract are subject at all times to rules adopted
18 by the secretary of transportation under s. 110.06 (2) and (2m) and by the
19 department.

20 **SECTION 5.** 343.12 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:
