3 153.60 (1) The department shall, by the first October 1 after the
4 commencement of each fiscal year, estimate the total amount of expenditures under
5 this chapter for the department and the board for that fiscal year for data collection,
6 database development and maintenance, generation of data files and standard
7 reports, orientation and training provided under s. 153.05 (9) (a) and maintaining
8 the board. The department shall assess the estimated total amount for that fiscal
9 year less the estimated total amount to be received for purposes of administration
10 of this chapter under s. 20.435 (4) (hi) during the fiscal year, the unencumbered
11 balance of the amount received for purposes of administration of this chapter under
12 s. 20.435 (4) (hi) from the prior fiscal year and the amount in the appropriation
13 account under s. 20.435 (1) (dg), 1997 stats., for the fiscal year, to health care
