This bill creates, in the department of health and family services (DHFS), ^{the} a pharmacy outreach program to provide patients with information about their eligibility for pharmaceutical manufacturer patient assistance programs, assist health care providers in enrolling their patients in these programs, provide health care providers with opportunities to work with pharmaceutical manufacturer representatives to improve the programs, and provide consultation with health care ^{the} providers about the pharmacy outreach program. DHFS may, under the bill, negotiate with pharmaceutical manufacturers to develop a simplified system to assist state residents in obtaining access to the pharmaceutical manufacturer patient assistance programs. Before March 1 of each year, DHFS must submit a report to the legislature and to the governor on the number of state residents who have benefited from pharmaceutical manufacturer patient assistance programs, the value of benefits provided by the programs, and other information that DHFS determines is relevant.

- 3. Assist health care providers in enrolling their patients in a pharmaceutical manufacturer patient assistance program under subd. 2.

4. Provide health care providers with opportunities to work with representatives of pharmaceutical manufacturers to improve pharmaceutical manufacturer patient assistance programs under subd. 2.

(d) The department may negotiate with pharmaceutical manufacturers to develop a ^{simple} ~~simplified~~ system to assist residents of this state in obtaining access to pharmaceutical manufacturer patient assistance programs. The system may include a ~~simplified~~ single application process and a voucher system for dispensing prescription drugs through local pharmacies.

(e) Before March 1 annually, the department shall submit a report to the chief clerk of each house of the legislature for distribution to the appropriate standing committees under s. 13.172 (3), and to the governor, on the number of residents of this state who have benefited from pharmaceutical manufacturer patient assistance

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill creates a pharmacy outreach program, to provide patients with information about their eligibility for pharmaceutical manufacturer patient assistance programs, assist health care providers in enrolling their patients in these programs, provide health care providers with opportunities to work with pharmaceutical manufacturer representatives to improve the programs and provide consultation with health care providers about the pharmacy outreach program. Under the bill, the Department may negotiate with pharmaceutical manufacturers to develop a simplified system to assist state residents in obtaining access to the pharmaceutical manufacturer patient assistance programs. Before March 1 of each year, the Department must submit a report to the Legislature and the Governor on the number of state residents who have benefited from pharmaceutical manufacturer patient assistance programs, the value of benefits provided by the programs, and other information that the Department determines is relevant.

Patient health care records can be released to state agencies to perform a legally authorized function such as program monitoring and evaluation. However, it should be noted that collecting performance-related information from the pharmaceutical companies would have to be done through a voluntary survey. The Department has no authority to mandate that pharmaceutical companies provide such information.

The total annual estimated fiscal effect of this bill is approximately \$941,800 GPR. In order to execute the mandated activities of the bill, it is estimated that the Department will require \$191,800 GPR annually to support a 1.0 FTE GPR Pharmacy Consultant, a 1.0 FTE GPR Program and Planning Analyst 5, and 0.5 FTE Program Assistant 2. In addition, it is estimated that the cost per eligible recipient of the program is \$3.00 for printing expenses, postage for direct mailing and other outreach activities. It is estimated that a statewide program would have at least 250,000 potential recipients. This would imply an estimated cost of \$750,000 GPR per year.

Thanks for the quick turnaround on our request for revisions to this draft. Your language on the toll-free number was right on target.

Just a few more additions, and I think we're done.

Please include a provision that requires DHFS to develop the program in coordination with SeniorCare. (We want to make sure the pharmacy outreach program isn't developed as a stand alone program. The intent is to have a program that complements SeniorCare, by helping seniors obtain already available, non-government funded prescription drug discounts).

Also include a provision that requires DHFS to work with state aging advocacy groups in developing the pharmacy outreach program.
