Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary:

This bill would impose a 10% surcharge on assessments imposed for environmental law violations. Revenues would be used for a youth education fund, administered in DNR to make payments to outside entities for environmental education programs. DNR is required to promulgate rules to establish eligibility for the payments, the application procedure, the maximum amount of payments, the kinds of programs that can receive payments, and the reporting procedures required of the contractors during and after completion of the program.

Fiscal Estimate:

Revenue. An existing 10% surcharge on environmental assessments has generated annual revenue over the past six years ranging from \$52,600 to \$129,500, and averaging about \$80,000 / year. This bill would impose another 10% surcharge. Depending upon the effective date of this legislation and promulgation of rules to administer the payments, it is estimated that approximately \$100,000-\$120,000 would be available to award contracts beginning July 1, 2005. Thereafter, fluctuating annual revenue would determine the number and amount of contracts that could be awarded, and this estimate assumes the average annual revenue would be \$80,000.

Expenditures. This bill would generate workload to administer the payment program that can't be absorbed by current staffing levels. Beginning July 1, 2004, an estimated .20 FTE would be required to initiate the rule-making process. In subsequent years, that .20 FTE would be required to administer the program. Salary and fringe for a .20 FTE Natural Resources Financial Assistance Specialist would amount to \$11,400, with an additional \$4,000 in support. Depending on the scope of contracts, additional workload could be required of other programs in reviewing content of the educational programs.
