## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill prohibits human cloning and parthenogenesis and provides a penalty of up to 10 years incarceration and a forfeiture for violations of the law.

The Department is unable to determine how many persons will be convicted of this crime. State costs will increase if an offender is sentenced to prison or placed on probation. It should be noted that the FY02 average annual cost to place an inmate in a DOC institution is approximately \$26,000 and \$1900 for probation. If offenders are sentenced to a county jail as a condition of probation county costs will increase.
