Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, circuit courts and municipal courts may suspend a person's motor vehicle operating privilege for a variety of reasons, including failure to pay an amount ordered by the court. Suspensions for failure to pay generally last until the person pays the amount owed. The suspension orders are forwarded to the department of transportation (DOT), which updates the person's driving record to reflect the suspension. However, under current law, circuit courts and municipal courts are not permitted to suspend a person's operating privilege solely because of the person's failure to pay a forfeiture imposed for an ordinance violation unrelated to the operation of a motor vehicle wholes the Person is a volunt.

This bill permits circuit courts and municipal courts to suspend the operating privilege of apperson solely because the person has not paid a forfeiture imposed for an ordinance violation unrelated to the operation of a motor vehicle.
