## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

Current law permits a municipality to pay the reasonable expenses of a municipal officer who is sued in his or her official capacity. This bill requires the municipality to pay these litigation expenses for an emergency medical services technician, first responder, fire fighter, or law enforcement or correctional officer unless the person resigns before the expenses are incurred or his or her employment is terminated for cause.

State fiscal effect:

This bill has no fiscal effect on the department of public instruction.

Local fiscal effect:

The department is unaware of any emergency medical services technicians, first responders, fire fighters, or law enforcement or correctional officers who are employed by school districts. Therefore, this bill would have no fiscal effect on local school districts.
