Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires a presumptive minimum sentence of 2 years imprisonment for a juvenile convicted of throwing a bodily substance at or toward another person while placed in a secured correctional facility, a secure detention facility, a secured child caring institution, or a secured group home.

Current law permits an adult court to sentence a juvenile who has been convicted of this violation to a period of confinement not to exceed 1.5 years and a period of extended supervision not to exceed 2 years.

Based on past admissions it is expected that approximately 2-3 persons/year will be admitted to prison for this crime. The precise fiscal impact will be dependent on the difference between the 2 year presumptive minimum and any lesser disposition that would have been imposed by the court on a juvenile convicted of this crime under current law. It costs approximately \$26,000/year to house an offender in an adult prison.
