Senator Harsdorf would like to request a bill draft relating to streamlining DPI waiver laws and rules. Under Wis. Stat. 118.38, the State Superintendent may grant school districts waivers from laws and rules, with some exceptions. School districts can request waivers from any requirements in chs. 115 to 121 or the administrative rules relating to those laws, with certain exceptions.

We would like to draft a bill that would change this waiver process. Under our bill, a school board could receive a waiver by holding a public hearing and submitting notice of its plan to DPI. All state assessments, basic student protections and accountability measures would remain in place (the exceptions in ch. 115 to 121).

Chris, you raise an interesting question that I had not thought of before. The waiver statute says that a school board may request a waiver of a schoool board or school district requirement. The statute does not explicitly allow waivers of school district "prohibitions." The revenue limit statute is a prohibition; i.e., "no school board may...." I don't know if DPI has interpreted the law to apply only when a statute uses the word "shall;" there may in fact be no requests like that to date. If you want to ensure that a school district could not "grant itself" a waiver of the revenue limits under your bill, I suggest specifically excluding those requests. In other words, I'd add it to the list in s. 118.38 (1) (a).

Per LRB 2489, which is the school district waiver bill we have been working on -

Does our bill allow school districts to grant themselves a waiver from the school district revenue limits? Currently, school boards can apply for a waiver from any school board or school district requirement in chs. 115 to 121. The revenue limit statute is Chapter 121, which may make it eligible, under our bill, for a waiver. This clearly would not be the intent of the bill. Below I have cut and pasted Wis. Statute 118.38.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

With certain exceptions, current law authorizes the Department of Public Instruction (DPI), upon receiving a request from a school board, to waive any school board or school district requirement in the laws and administrative rules governing elementary and secondary education. Before making a request, the school board must hold a public hearing on the request in the school district. In determining whether to grant the waiver, DPI must consider whether the requirement impedes progress toward achieving a local improvement plan and, if the school district has adopted educational goals, whether it impedes progress toward achieving those goals.

This bill requires DPI to grant a waiver upon receiving a request from a school board if the school board has held a public hearing on the request.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 118.38 (2) of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

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118.38 <b>(2)</b>	The department shall approve a request under sub. (1) (a) if the
