### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill prohibits the University of Wisconsin System and all private colleges and universities in Wisconsin from assigning an undergraduate student to a dormitory or residence hall unless: 1) the student provides proof that he or she has been vaccinated against bacterial meningitis within 12 months of the proposed assignment; or 2) the college or university has provided detailed information on the risks associated with bacterial meningitis and the availability and effectiveness of vaccines against the disease and the student (or his or her parent or guardian, if the student is a minor) signs a waiver that he or she has reviewed the information and has chosen not to be vaccinated.

# The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **Section 1.** 36.25 (46) of the statutes is created to read:
- 5 36.25 (46) Bacterial meningitis. The board may not assign an undergraduate
- 6 student to a dormitory or residence hall unless one of the following occurs:

(a) The student submits proof to the appropriate campus office that he or she
has been vaccinated against bacterial meningitis within 12 months of the proposed
assignment.



### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill prohibits the University of Wisconsin System and all private colleges and universities in Wisconsin from permitting an undergraduate student to occupy a dormitory or residence hall unless: 1) the student provides proof that he or she has been vaccinated against meningococcal disease within 12 months of the initial occupancy of the dormitory or residence hall; or 2) the college or university has provided detailed information on the risks associated with meningococcal disease and the availability and effectiveness of vaccines against the disease and the student (or his or her parent or guardian, if the student is a minor) affirms that he or she has reviewed the information and has chosen not to be vaccinated.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

36.25 (46) MENINGOCOCCAL DISEASE. The board may not permit an undergraduate student to occupy a dormitory or residence hall unless one of the following occurs:

(a) The student submits proof to the appropriate campus office that he or she

- (a) The student submits proof to the appropriate campus office that he or she has been vaccinated against meningococcal disease within 12 months of his or her initial occupancy of a dormitory or residence hall. After this initial proof of vaccination is provided, the student is not required to provide proof for subsequent occupancies. Proof of vaccination shall include documentation from the health care provider who administered the vaccination or shall include a statement signed by the student or, if the student is younger than 18 years of age, by the student's parent or guardian, that specifies the date on which the vaccination was administered and the health care provider who administered the vaccination or the facility at which the vaccination was administered.
- (b) The board provides detailed information on the risks associated with meningococcal disease and the availability and effectiveness of vaccines against the disease to the student, if he or she is at least 18 years old, or to the student's parent or guardian, if the student is a minor, and the individual who is provided the information affirms that he or she has reviewed the information and has chosen not to be vaccinated or has chosen not to have the minor vaccinated. Once the individual so affirms, the board is not required to obtain subsequent affirmations.

**SECTION 2.** Subchapter V of chapter 39 [precedes 39.81] of the statutes is created to read:

**CHAPTER 39** 

SUBCHAPTER V

#### PRIVATE COLLEGES AND

#### UNIVERSITIES

39.81 Meningococcal disease. A private college or university may not permit an undergraduate student to occupy a dormitory or residence hall unless one of the following occurs:

- (1) The student submits proof to the college or university that he or she has been vaccinated against meningococcal disease within 12 months of his or her initial occupancy of a dormitory or residence hall. After this initial proof of vaccination is provided, the student is not required to provide proof for subsequent occupancies. Proof of vaccination shall include documentation from the health care provider who administered the vaccination or shall include a statement signed by the student or, if the student is younger than 18 years of age, by the student's parent or guardian, that specifies the date on which the vaccination was administered and the health care provider who administered the vaccination or the facility at which the vaccination was administered.
- (2) The college or university provides detailed information on the risks associated with meningococcal disease and the availability and effectiveness of vaccines against the disease to the student, if he or she is at least 18 years old, or to the student's parent or guardian, if the student is a minor, and the individual who is provided the information affirms that he or she has reviewed the information and has chosen not to be vaccinated or has chosen not to have the minor vaccinated. Once the individual so affirms, the college or university is not required to obtain subsequent affirmations.
