Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The department anticipates receiving 50 complaints per year alleging healthcare personnel have been retaliated against for refusing to work mandatory overtime.

Retaliation complaints would be investigated by an Equal Rights Officer-Senior. An investigator has the capacity to complete eleven investigations per month. The department expects to need 1/2 Equal Rights Officer-Senior position to investigate cases and answer inquiries concerning this bill. The cost to the department for this Equal Rights Officer-Senior would be \$32,350 (\$19,500 salary, \$7,100 fringe benefits and \$5,750 supplies and services) plus a one-time cost of \$6,500 to set the position up with office equipment plus PC.

Approximately ten of the 50 complaints will require the department to hold a hearing on the complaint. A department administrative law judge would hold the hearing and has the capacity to hold 11 hearings each month. The department believes it can absorb the increased hearing workload without additional funding.

The department will incur one-time costs of \$1,500 to develop, print and distribute posters this bill would require healthcare institutions to post.

The department assumes the cost of local governments hiring additional staff at their healthcare facilities to avoid mandatory overtime will be more expensive than paying existing employees the overtime premium pay but the actual additional costs are unknown.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The department anticipates the 50 complaints per year will continue for the foreseeable future. The queston of what constitutes "unforeseeable emergencies" will continue to lead to employee-employer disputes that will result in filed complaints.
