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

LRB 2667/1 on my inital review looked fine, so I had it jacketed. Since then, my constituent who was out of town returned and look over the draft making what I think is a valid suggestiton. So I would ask that you create a /2 which contains the following.

Page 2 Line 2. Change the term "topsoil" to "soils".

I also spoke with Mark Patronski about what exactly "from an area of less than 3 acres for the purpose of crating a pond or wetland might be interpreted to mean."

Could that be interpreted to mean that the 3 acres is a total of soil removed to create 1 pond regardless of the size of the area.

Could it be interpreted to mean that in an area you could have as many ponds as you like as long as no single pond is in excess of 3 acres?

To address these concerns Mark suggests and Dale is open to including adding the following language to the draft.

"This exemption allows any number of ponds or wetlands on a single parcel of land."
