#### **CONCLUSION:**

There is no basis on which to calculate the ongoing fiscal impact of this proposal.

DMV would be able to accommodate this new type of conviction without any computer system changes resulting in no one-time costs.

BASIS FOR CONCLUSION: We identify the following areas of indeterminate fiscal impact:

Ongoing State Cost Increase -

- Additional drug screening tests provided by the State Lab of Hygiene.
- Additional arrests by State Patrol officers.
- Additional need for Drug Recognition Expert training among State Patrol officers.
- Additional driver license suspensions and revocations processed by DMV.

Ongoing State Revenue Increase -

- Additional funds from traffic forfeitures.
- Additions fees collected for license reinstatements and occupational licenses.

Ongoing Local Cost Increase -

- Additional arrests by local law enforcement officers
- Additional need for Drug Recognition Expert training among local law enforcement officers.

Ongoing Local Revenue Increase -

- Additional funds from traffic forfeitures.
