 - (a) 11. of the statutes; **relating to:** state government holidays.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, nonrepresented state employees receive a total of nine paid holidays annually, while represented employees receive only the paid holidays provided for in their collective bargaining agreements. This bill provides that November 11 (the day on which Veterans Day is traditionally celebrated) is a day on which the offices of the agencies of state government are closed. In addition, the bill increases the number of paid holidays for nonrepresented state employees from nine to ten days. Represented state employees continue to have the paid holidays provided for in their collective bargaining agreements.
