SENATE SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT, TO 2003 SENATE BILL 250

AN ACT relating to: providing grants for research, programs, and exhibits relating to Hmong culture and history and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Nonstatutory provisions.

(1) (a) From the appropriation under section 20.285 (1) (ft) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 2003, the Wisconsin Humanities Council shall, in the 2004–05 fiscal year, award grants to persons in no more than 10 counties to research, document, interpret, and develop educational materials, exhibits, and programs related to Hmong culture and history. In awarding the grants, the Wisconsin Humanities Council shall give priority to persons in counties with significant Hmong populations, including Milwaukee, Marathon, Brown, Sheboygan, Outagamie, LaCrosse, and Dane counties. No grant may exceed \$20,000, and, as a condition of

- receiving a grant, each grant recipient shall provide matching funds equal to at least 25 percent of the amount of the grant.
- (b) The Wisconsin Humanities Council may use up to \$15,000 of the amount appropriated to the council in the 2004–05 fiscal year for the administration of the grant program under paragraph (a).
- (c) Notwithstanding section 16.42 (1) (e) of the statutes, in submitting information under section 16.42 of the statutes for purposes of the 2005–07 biennial budget act, the board of regents of the University of Wisconsin System shall submit information concerning the appropriation under section 20.285 (1) (ft) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 2003, as though the increase of \$150,000 in the 2004–05 fiscal year for grants related to Hmong culture and history had not been made.

Section 2. Appropriation changes.

(1) Grants related to Hmong culture and history. In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the board of regents of the University of Wisconsin System under section 20.285 (1) (ft) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 2003, the dollar amount is increased by \$150,000 for fiscal year 2004–05 for making grants related to Hmong culture and history.
