Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, whoever threatens bodily harm to the person or family member of a judge, a witness, or an official, employee, or agent of the Department of Revenue, Department of Commerce, or Department of Workforce Development is guilty of a class H felony.

This bill additionally prohibits threats of bodily harm against social service workers, juvenile intake workers, or school employees under the following conditions: 1. the person making the threat knows or should have known that the victim is, or is a family member of, a social service worker, juvenile intake worker, or school employee; 2. the victim is acting in his or her official capacity at the time of the threat or the threat is made in response to any action taken in an official capacity; and 3. the victim does not consent to the threat. A person who violates this prohibition may be fined up to \$10,000, imprisoned up to six years, or both.

This bill would not have a fiscal effect on the Department of Health and Family Services or county departments of human or social services.
