Justin: Per our phone discussion, here are some files containing background information on the fish we found in the Rock R and snakeheads in general. From the DNR perspective, we are also concerned about other invasive exotic species that can survive and create problems in Wisconsin waters. Asian carp (grass, silver, bighead and black carps) are a good example. After studying issues like creating public understanding and enforceability, many other states have concluded that the best approach is simply to ban possession and transport of live specimens of potentially harmful exotic species and their hybrids. The list of species could be included in the legislation or if more flexibility to handle future discoveries of new species is needed, it could be promulgated and maintained as an administrative rule by an agency. At a minimum we would include the temperate snakeheads (e.g. northern snakehead), Asian carps, ruffe, gokies, zebra mussels and other European and Asiatic temparate mollusks, rusty crayfish, rainbow smelt, and alewife. Most states also allow permitting in selected situations (e.g. scientific research) which I assume would be OK here. Please note that we here in DNR have been discussing this over the past year with folks in DATCP and the aquaculture and bait industry and they may have some other ideas about what should be on the list as we have not gotten that specific in our discussions to date. The DATCP contacts are Will Hughes (224-5142) and Dr. Myron Kebus (224-4876). The president of the Wisconsin Aquaculture Association is Ron Johnson of Iron River (715-372-4219) and the chairman is Dave Gollon Jr. (608-935-2098). The president of the Wisconsin Fish and Bait Dealers Association is Dave Robinson (262-279-6888). Those folks would be key players in developing a proposal with aquaculture and bait industry buy-in.



Reasoning: Apparently it is a fairly common practice to dump aquarium fish into ponds that are a part of registered fish farms. (They lease a lot of small outlying freeze out farm ponds) When these ponds are seined those aquarium invasive are found. The issue here is not so much the fish, but any diseases which they may Considering all fish from fish farms have to have a health certificate, if they are contaminated by a disease introduced by this dumping of aquarium fish they experience a monetary loss. The farm raised fish have to be destroyed.

Also if someone dumps a fish into a pond or public waters of the state and DNR or someone else seines or poisons to remove them, other fish including game fish and bait become collateral damage. That has a cost.

- (2) No person may release any live invasive nonnative aquatic species listed under sub. (1) or designated under sub. (3), or its viable eggs or offspring, into the waters of the state or into the waters of a fish farm, as defined in s. 95.001 (1) (aj), except as approved by the department.
- (3) The department of natural resources shall, in consultation with the department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection, designate by rule other live invasive nonnative aquatic species that no person may possess, control, store, offer for sale or transport.
- (4) A person may possess, control, store, offer for sale, or transport a live invasive nonnative aquatic species listed under sub. (1) or designated under sub. (3) or its viable eggs or offspring that is used for educational purposes or scientific research if approved by the department or for other uses as established by rule.
- (5) (a) Except for fish farms registered under s. 95.60 (3m), to enforce this section, a warden or a representative of the department, upon presentation of his or her credentials to a person involved in the possession, control, storage, sale, or transportation of an aquatic species, including a bait dealer, a person operating a vehicle or boat for that person, or an employee or agent acting on behalf of that person, may do all of the following:
- 1. Enter any building or structure where an aquatic species is stored, processed, packed, or held, where the person's records or reports are kept, where the vehicles, boats, equipment, or materials used in the person's business are located, or where activities related to the person's business are conducted.
  - 2. Enter any vehicle or boat used to transport or hold the aquatic species.

3. Inspect any aquatic species in the possession of the person, records or reports
of the person, and buildings, structures, vehicles, boats, equipment, and materials
related to the person's business.

- 4. Take reasonable diagnostic samples of an aquatic species for biological examination.
- 5. Seize and dispose of any live invasive nonnative aquatic species listed under sub. (1) or designated under sub. (3), or its viable eggs or offspring.
- (b) No person may prohibit entry, prohibit an inspection to be conducted, or fail to produce all of the records or reports requested under this subsection.
  - **SECTION 2.** 29.971 (15) of the statutes is created to read:
- 29.971 (15) (a) For the violation of s. 29.426 (1), (3), or (5) (b), by a forfeiture of not less than \$500 nor more than \$5,000.
- (b) For the violation of s. 29.426 (2), by a forfeiture of not less that \$500 nor more than \$5,000. In addition, the court may order a person who is convicted of a violation under sub. (2) to restore any natural resource damaged by the violation, to pay any costs related to the removal of the species, eggs, or offspring, to pay any costs resulting from the violation, and to take other appropriate action or pay for any action necessary to eliminate or minimize any environmental damage caused by the violation.

#### **SECTION 3.** 95.60 (9) of the statutes is created to read:

95.60 (9) (a) To enforce s. 29.426, a representative of the department, upon presentation of his or her credentials to a person involved in the possession, control, storage, sale, or transportation of an aquatic species at a fish farm, to a person operating a vehicle or boat for that person, or to an employee or agent acting on behalf of that person, may do all of the following:
