

2003 SENATE BILL 417

January 29, 2004 – Introduced by Senators SCHULTZ, WELCH, S. FITZGERALD and BROWN, cosponsored by Representatives JOHNSRUD, HAHN, PETROWSKI, MUSSER, ALBERS, TOWNS, HINES, TOWNSEND, STONE, FREESE, LOTHIAN, WARD, GRONEMUS and GUNDERSON. Referred to Committee on Transportation and Information Infrastructure.

1 **AN ACT** *to create* 348.07 (2) (im) of the statutes; **relating to:** trailers used to
2 transport livestock.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, with limited exceptions, no one may operate a single vehicle that exceeds 40 feet in length without obtaining a permit from the Department of Transportation.

This bill creates an exception for a two-vehicle combination that is used to transport livestock and that does not exceed 75 feet in length.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 **SECTION 1.** 348.07 (2) (im) of the statutes is created to read:

4 348.07 (2) (im) Seventy-five total feet for a 2-vehicle combination transporting
5 livestock.
