RESIDENTIAL WELL AIR FILTRATION

Residential wells, in certain instances, would be required to filter air that enters the well to prevent airborne bacteria from contaminating the well water. Industry standard requires a .22-micron filter that will bar bacteria from entering the well.

A filter installation would be required in one of two situations: (1) when a residential well tests positive for bacteria; and (2) when a new well is installed. In all other instances, installing a bacteria filter would be the option of the well owner.

This would only apply to wells that are drilled, with a casing, not driven (sandpoint).
