Cancer drug donation repository				

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires the Department to establish and maintain a cancer drug repository program by July 1, 2005. The program would allow individuals to donate a cancer drug that may be prescribed for use by an individual who meets eligibility criteria specified by rule by the Department. The bill provides that the cancer drugs may be donated to a medical facility or pharmacy that elects to participate in the program. Participating facilities may dispense the drugs according to standards developed by the Department in rule.

To implement the provision of this bill, the Department would be required to set up and maintain a data base for the cancer drug repository which included information on participating facilities and individuals seeking to donate drugs or to obtain donated drugs. The Department would be required to promulgate rules regarding requirements for facilities to accept and dispose of donated drugs, eligibility criteria for the program, and standards and procedures for accepting, donating, monitoring, inspecting, and dispensing the drugs.

It is assumed that the majority of applicants for donated drugs in this program would be uninsured. Currently 26,000 individuals are diagnosed with cancer annually. It is estimated that approximately 8,000 of these will undergo some form of chemotherapy, which would involve the use of cancer treatment drugs. In Wisconsin, an estimated 11% of the population has no medical insurance. If this same percentage applies to individuals receiving chemotherapy, approximately 900 people annually may wish to apply to a cancer registry for drugs.

The workload associated with developing and maintaining the cancer registry data base and preparing administrative rules cannot be absorbed by current staff. An additional .5 FTE Program and Planning Analyst would be required to perform these functions, at a cost of \$25,700 GPR the first year and \$18,500 GPR annually. The cost of preparing information for patients and facilities in the program and distributing this information is estimated at \$5,000 GPR in the first year and \$500 annually. Total costs of this program are estimated at \$30,700 GPR in the first year of the program and \$19,000 GPR annually.
