### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The department doesn't anticipate that any employers will register with the department to conduct business in Wisconsin as an employer of traveling sales crews. This bill places similar restrictions on traveling sales crews that were placed on employers of minors engaged in door-to-door sales a number of years ago. That earlier legislation led to no more than one employer registering with the department in any given year. The department expects a similar impact with this legislation.

The department also anticipates that it will receive no more than one or two complaints each year about traveling sales crews illegally operating in Wisconsin. The department anticipates it will take approximately 40 hours to fully investigate each complaint using an Equal Rights Officer-Senior. The department believes can absorb the additional workload.

The department will also have to develop administrative regulations to implement this legislation. The cost of developing these regulations and preparing brochures to explain this new law and regulations to the public will be a one time cost of \$1,500.00.

The department doesn't anticipate any local financial impact with this legislation. Enforcement of the bill's provisions will be handled by the department. Local municipalities will only incur costs if they choose to establish similar local ordinances.
