## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

SB 514 would require the Dept. of Tourism to promote travel to downtowns.

To some extent, the Department currently promotes downtown areas (shopping areas, restaurants, museums, arts/theatre, festivals, events, etc). However, if additional promotion was required, it would result in either redirecting funding from current promotions or additional funding (either GPR or PR-gaming) would be necessary.

The specific amount of state funding needed would depend on the level and scope of promotion the bill authors were intending.
