

## 2003 SENATE BILL 541

March 10, 2004 – Introduced by Senator HANSEN. Referred to Committee on Environment and Natural Resources.

1     **AN ACT** *to renumber and amend* 29.164 (3) (b) 1.; *to amend* 29.164 (3) (b) 2.,  
2           29.164 (3) (c) (intro.), 29.164 (3) (cg), 29.164 (3) (ci), 29.164 (3) (cm), 29.164 (3)  
3           (cr) 1. and 29.563 (13) (a); and *to create* 29.164 (3) (b) 1g. and 29.563 (2) (a) 10.  
4           of the statutes; **relating to:** wild turkey hunting licenses issued to resident  
5           senior citizens.

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### ***Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau***

Under current law, no person may hunt wild turkey unless the person has a wild turkey hunting license, or other license authorizing the hunting of wild turkey, and a wild turkey hunting stamp attached to, or imprinted on, the license. Under current law, the Department of Natural Resources issues wild turkey hunting licenses to applicants according to a preference system. Under that system, qualified resident landowners receive first preference in obtaining a wild turkey hunting license. An applicant is a qualified resident landowner if the applicant is a state resident and owns at least 50 acres in one parcel in an established wild turkey hunting zone. State residents who have applied for, but who were not issued, a wild turkey hunting license in a previous season (previous resident applicants) receive second preference. All other resident applicants receive third preference. Nonresident landowners meeting similar qualifications as qualified resident landowners receive fourth preference, and all other nonresidents receive fifth, or last preference.

This bill gives first preference to residents who are at least 65 years old (resident senior citizens) under the preference system. As a result, qualified resident

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landowners receive second preference and all the other preference categories follow the qualified resident landowner preference category in the same order as they do under current law.

The bill exempts resident senior citizens from having to pay the base fee for a resident wild turkey hunting license. The bill does not exempt them from being issued, and paying for, a wild turkey hunting stamp or from any of the supplemental fees, such as the wildlife damage surcharge and license and stamp issuing fees.

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***The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:***

1           **SECTION 1.** 29.164 (3) (b) 1. of the statutes is renumbered 29.164 (3) (b) 1m. and  
2 amended to read:

3           29.164 (3) (b) 1m. The department shall create a first 2nd preference category  
4 in the issuance of wild turkey hunting licenses to applicants who are qualified  
5 resident landowners. The number of licenses issued under this paragraph for a  
6 season for an established wild turkey hunting zone may not exceed 30% of all licenses  
7 issued for that season for that zone.

8           **SECTION 2.** 29.164 (3) (b) 1g. of the statutes is created to read:

9           29.164 (3) (b) 1g. The department shall create a first preference category in the  
10 issuance of wild turkey hunting licenses to applicants who are resident senior  
11 citizens.

12           **SECTION 3.** 29.164 (3) (b) 2. of the statutes, as affected by 2003 Wisconsin Act  
13 67, is amended to read:

14           29.164 (3) (b) 2. For purposes of subd. 1- 1m., a qualified resident landowner  
15 is a resident who owns at least 50 acres in one parcel in an established wild turkey  
16 hunting zone. If more than one individual is the landowner of a single parcel of land,  
17 only one individual may be considered a qualified resident landowner.

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1           **SECTION 4.** 29.164 (3) (c) (intro.) of the statutes is amended to read:

2           29.164 (3) (c) *Second Third preference.* (intro.) The department shall create  
3 a ~~2nd~~ 3rd preference category in issuing wild turkey hunting licenses to resident  
4 applicants who in a previous season applied for but were not issued wild turkey  
5 hunting licenses:

6           **SECTION 5.** 29.164 (3) (cg) of the statutes is amended to read:

7           29.164 (3) (cg) *Third Fourth preference.* The department shall create a ~~3rd~~ 4th  
8 preference category in issuing wild turkey hunting licenses to all other resident  
9 applicants.

10          **SECTION 6.** 29.164 (3) (ci) of the statutes is amended to read:

11          29.164 (3) (ci) *Fourth Fifth preference.* The department shall create a ~~4th~~ 5th  
12 preference category in issuing wild turkey hunting licenses to applicants who are  
13 qualified nonresident landowners. For purposes of this paragraph, a qualified  
14 nonresident landowner is a person who is not a resident and who owns at least 50  
15 acres in one parcel in an established wild turkey hunting zone and who agrees to  
16 allow other persons to hunt wild turkeys on that land if those persons first obtain  
17 permission to hunt from the landowner. If more than one individual is the landowner  
18 of a single parcel of land, only one individual may be considered a qualified  
19 nonresident landowner.

20          **SECTION 7.** 29.164 (3) (cm) of the statutes is amended to read:

21          29.164 (3) (cm) *Fifth Sixth preference.* The department shall create a ~~5th~~ 6th  
22 preference category in issuing wild turkey hunting licenses to all other nonresident  
23 applicants.

24          **SECTION 8.** 29.164 (3) (cr) 1. of the statutes is amended to read:
