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Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, no person may hunt wild turkey unless be orche has a wild turkey hunting license, or other license authorizing the hunting of wild turkey, and a wild turkey hunting stamp attached to, or imprinted on, the license. Under current law, the Department of Natural Resources issues wild turkey hunting licenses to applicants according to a preference system. Under that system, qualified resident landowners receive first preference in obtaining a wild turkey hunting license. An applicant is a qualified resident landowner if the applicant is a state resident and owns at least 50 acres in one parcel in an established wild turkey hunting zone. State residents who have applied for, but who were not issued, a wild turkey hunting license in a previous season (previous resident applicants) receive second preference. All other resident applicants receive third preference. Nonresident landowners meeting similar qualifications as qualified resident landowners receive fourth preference, and all other nonresidents receive fifth, or last preference.

This bill gives first preference to residents who are at least 65 years old (resident senior citizens) under the preference system. As a result, qualified resident landowners receive second preference and all the other preference categories follow the qualified resident landowner preference category in the same order as they do under current law.

The bill exempts resident senior citizens from having to pay the base fee for a resident wild turkey hunting license. The bill does not exempt them from being

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issued, and paying for, a wild turkey hunting stamp or from any of the supplemental fees, such as the wildlife damage surcharge and license and stamp issuing fees.

29.164 (3) (ci) Fourth Fifth preference. The department shall create a 4th 5th preference category in issuing wild turkey hunting licenses to applicants who are qualified nonresident landowners. For purposes of this paragraph, a qualified nonresident landowner is a person who is not a resident and who owns at least 50 acres in one parcel in an established wild turkey hunting zone and who agrees to allow other persons to hunt wild turkeys on that land if those persons first obtain permission to hunt from the landowner. If more than one individual is the landowner of a single parcel of land, only one individual may be considered a qualified nonresident landowner.

In issuing licenses under the 2nd 3rd preference category under this subsection, the department shall give, within that preference category, a preference point to each applicant for each previous corresponding season for which the person applied but was not issued a wild turkey hunting license. The department shall create subcategories for each point total and place each applicant in the applicable subcategory. The department shall rank the subcategories according to the number of preference points received, giving higher priority to those subcategories with more points than those with fewer points. Applicants who fail to apply at least once during any 3 consecutive years shall lose all previously accumulated preference points.

(1) A This act first applies to applications for wild turkey hunting licenses that are submitted on the effective date of this subsection for the first wild turkey hunting season to begin after the effective date of this subsection.

DRAFTER'S NOTE FROM THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU



- 1. As drafted, the basic wild turkey hunting license issued to resident senior citizens will be free of charge. However, there a number of additional fees that are added to wild turkey hunting licenses: a wildlife damage surcharge, a wild turkey hunting stamp, an issuing fee for both the license and the stamp, and a processing fee for the application. I have done the following regarding these fees:
- a. I have not exempted turkey licenses issued to resident senior citizens from the \$1 wildlife damage surcharge since damage by wild turkeys is included under the wildlife damage programs.
- b. I have not exempted turkey licenses issued to resident senior citizens from the turkey hunting stamp requirement or from the required fee for the stamp. This stamp costs \$5.25.
- c. I have not exempted turkey hunting licenses or stamps issued to resident senior citizens from issuing fees, 75 cents and 25 cents respectively.
- d. I have not exempted the applications submitted by resident senior citizens from the processing fee and issuing fee for such applications (a total of \$3) since applications from resident senior citizens will be processed through the cumulative preference system.

Please let me know if you want any changes in regard to the above.
