Whereas, Mr. Reuther served on the senate Committee on Education and Public Welfare; and

Whereas, during his tenure in the senate, Mr. Reuther introduced legislation to regulate cigarctte sales to minors, license food handlers, and legalize bingo; and

Whereas, Mr. Reuther subsequently worked for the Milwaukee Braves, where he was in charge of ticket sales; and

Whereas, when he learned that the Milwaukee Braves were leaving the city, Mr. Reuther applied to the City of Milwaukee treasurer's office and worked there for 18 years, retiring in 1981; now, therefore, be it
